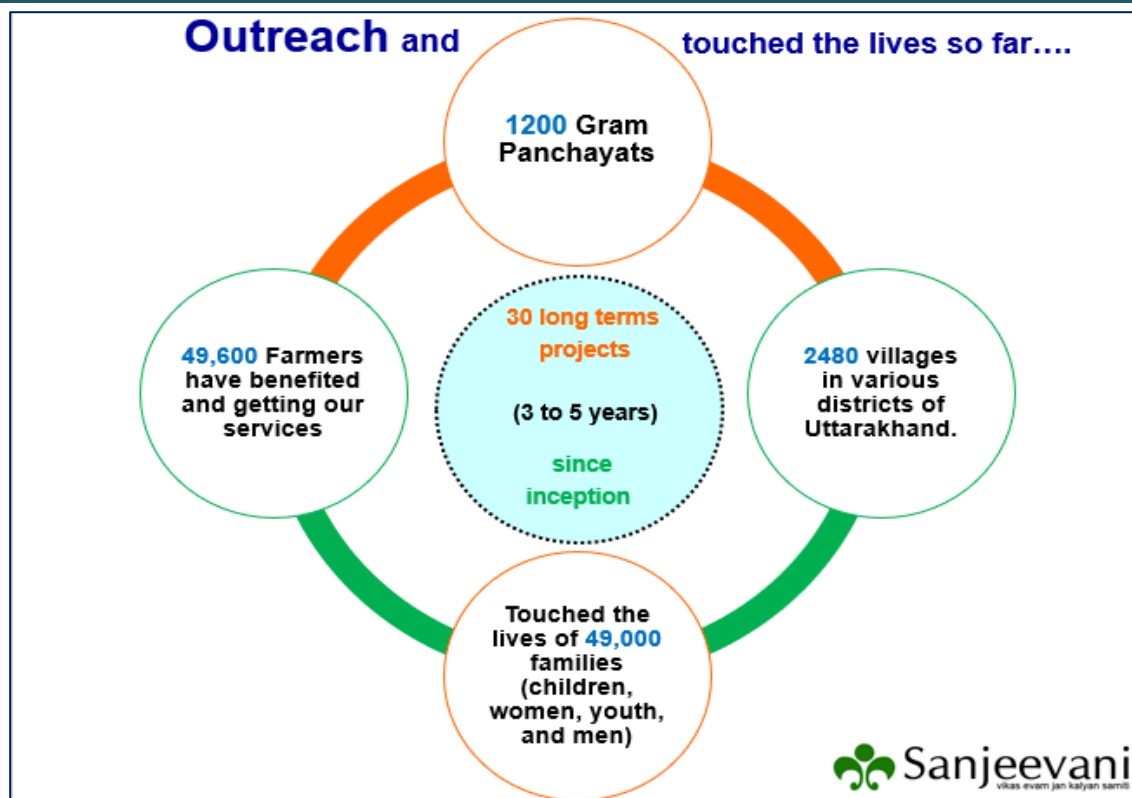
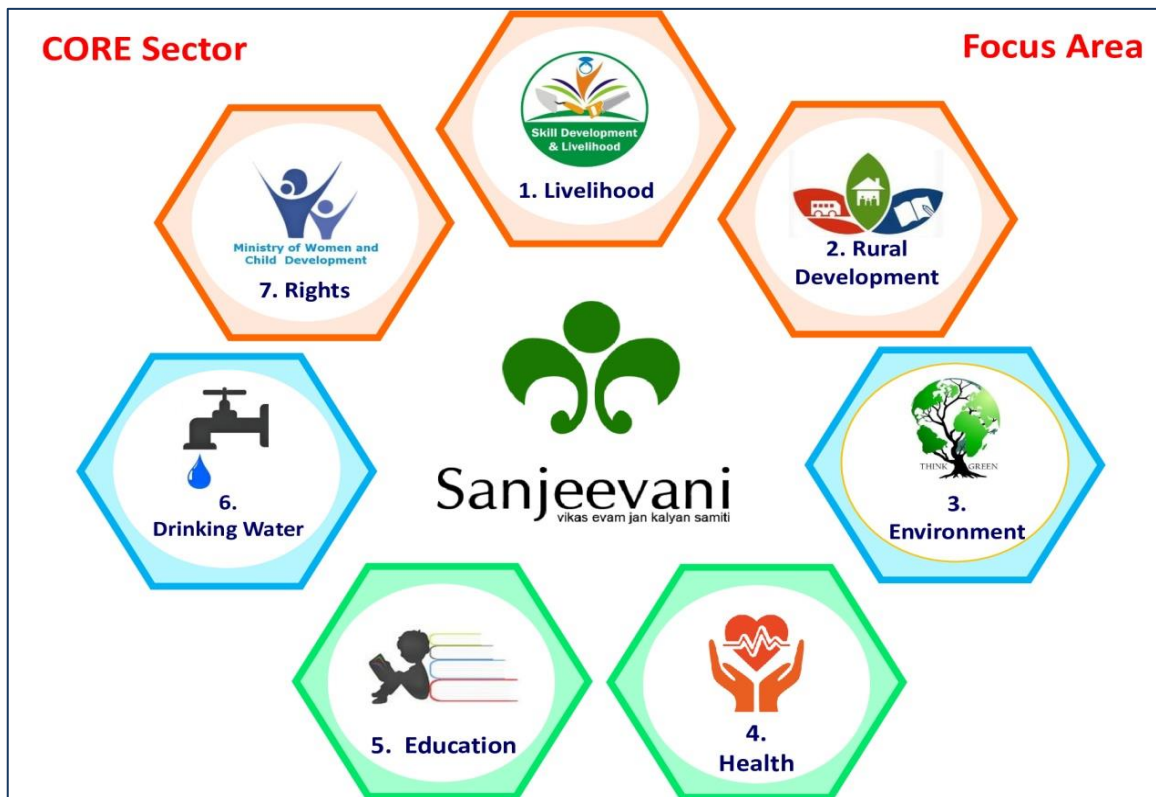

<p style="text-align: center;">RURAL DEVELOPMENT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Rural development has been focused through integrated approach through the participation of people. We have collaborated with SBI as part of CSR initiatives. We have shown great results for the community. Currently, 5 villages are adopted for the integrated development of the villages (health, education, infrastructure development, livelihood, digitalization, skill development, environment activities, linking government schemes etc).
<p style="text-align: center;">LIVELIHOOD</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ In livelihood, we have emphasized modern techniques of agriculture and horticulture, Organic agriculture, cash crops and others. We have collaborated with NABARD, Banks and other financial institutions for business startup initiatives. ❑ Sanjeevani also works on livelihood option for vulnerable section and persons with disabilities. We have formed 370 community based organization in the Uttarakhand. We also have formed 250 SHG group members for livelihood and small business activities. We have catered the livelihood initiatives to 2500 Families in various trades of farm & non-farm activities. ❑ Organization imparted 220 Sustainable Livelihood Trainings on various trades of farm and non-farm trades. 4976 number of persons have started to earn their livelihood Income. Out of which 257 have become Master Trainers and executing their livelihood and working as business entity and at the same time they have started imparting training to others. 135 Master trainers have become Resource Person & imparted training in their area and associated with other programmes also. In this continuation, we have gone extra mile to expand our horizon by forming 4 Farmers Producers Organizations. Now Farmers have come under formed FPOs umbrella. Farmers have started their sale through FPOs. These new borne FPOs will work as business entity very soon in upcoming time. ❑ We have converged government schemes and services worth of Rs.1.57 crore around covering all our projects and particularly livelihood and integrated rural development. ❑ Afforestation: A huge plantation has done under Oak Tasar program. The program is being implemented for the upliftment and livelihood creation of tribal families in Bageshwar district.
<p style="text-align: center;">SKILL DEVELOPMENT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ As livelihood and skill development activities, we have provided skills to unemployed/uneducated youth various skills in linking them with local skill training academy which is certified by government. 1800 youth and women are given various skill training so far. ❑ We are also continually working on financial literacy campaign in the



	<p>districts of Uttarakhand.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ A Prerna Center for stitching work has been established under SBI Gram Seva program. This endeavor will open new avenue for rural women in livelihood creation. By the end of March 57 rural women have taken a structured training of stitching.❑ Bee Keeping training (3Nos), Backyard Poultry training (13 Participants), Goat rearing (12) have imparted throughout the year. After the training, participants have started their enterprises. Slowly and gradually they are enhancing their business.
EDUCATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Sanjeevani established one school namely Rajput Convent School in Present context, class LKG to class 8th is running in the school. The main objective of the school is to impart a good and modern education to local kids in reasonable prices with modern techniques.❑ We have focused on the Computer education, smart education and remedial classes of village kids and students under SBI Gram Seva. 5 Computer classes, 5 smart classes and 5 Remedial classes from Primary level to Intermediate has been organized through the year in SBI Gram Seva intervention area.❑ 4 students got scholarship under SBI Gram Sevaprogramme in various activities namely education, Sports & cultural activities. Per year each student received the scholarship amount of INR. 20,000.00. One of the scholarship children along with their team received 1st prize in cultural activities at EGAAS Mahotsav in District Pauri.❑ This year Shiv Nadar Foundation and HCL has signed an MoU with Sanjeevani for VidyaGyan Program. Meritorious students from rural and urban, economically underprivileged communities who fulfill the eligibility criteria at VidyGyan-one of India's top residential schools established under the aegis of Shiv Nadar Foundation and HCL. With this initial step, 6 children have selected in VIDYGyan school campus.
ENVIRONMENT ACTIVITIES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Sanjeevani is the partner of Fair Climate Network Bangalore for Carbon mitigation project across the country. And our organization has completed 10,000 house hold survey for the purpose. For the same, Sanjeevani has registered our project from Gold Standard Foundation. In the first phase, we have initiated in the distribution of smokeless woodstove. We are connected with 1550 HHSs. This year we have generated 8589.5 tons of CERS.❑ Afforestation & Tree Plantation: We have planted around 8170 (Tem. Fruits – 950, other plants -7220) during this year.❑ We have renovated 7 drinking water schemes and we have prepared 4 new water schemes.❑ We have prepared 4 water tanks for drinking water facilities. Each water tank contains 10 KL capacity.



HEALTH, HYGIENE, SANITATION & WASTE MANAGEMENT

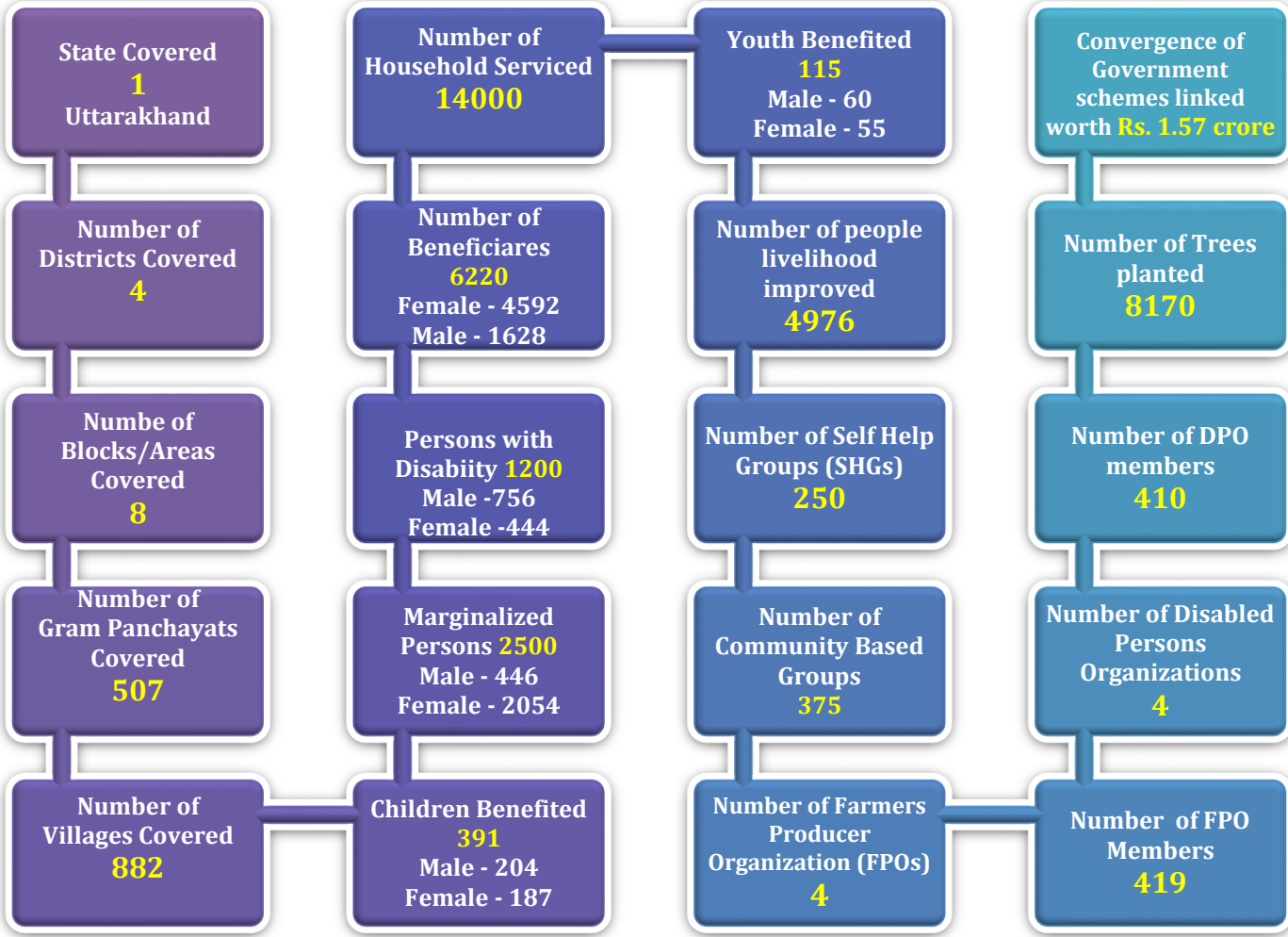
- ❑ Organization has renovated one Health Centre in SBI Gram Seva intervention area and made functional non-functional health center. And started one baby delivery Centre in association with District Health Department. A great boom is seeing after the reopening of Baby Delivery Centre. In this year, around **15 baby delivery** took place where 4 baby deliveries are from other villages also. Indeed, it's a good sign to the area. 9 Health Campaigns has organized in this financial year. These health camps on the one hand benefited SBI Gram Seva intervention area and on the other hand other adjoining villages also benefited.
- ❑ Sanjeevani social workers motivated 20 persons for the construction of their toilets.
- ❑ Under waste management 55 compost pits, vermin compost beds has distributed under PKVY Scheme.
- ❑ We have conducted 96 clean up campaigns.
- ❑ For the waste decomposition we have distributed 440 dustbins to the villagers under SBIG Gram Seva.
- ❑ Villagers have prepared 7 dumping yards under our supervision.

WORKING WITH WOMEN AND CHILDREN

- ❑ Sanjeevani has been executing **The Hunger Project** in development block Takula, district Almora (Uttarakhand). This project aims to support every elected woman representative to be empowered with PRIs fund function and functionaries concept fulfilling life of self-reliance and dignity. We have worked in financial year 2019-20 with **51 gram panchayats with 251 Elected Women Representatives.**
- ❑ Sanjeevani runs child helpline in collaboration with **Childline India Foundation.** We are working in the entire districts for child rights and child protection.
- ❑ We have covered **4953 children, 3675 adults and 2100 stakeholders.**
- ❑ Sanjeevani has formed Self Help Groups (SHGs) for women. We have nearly about **250 SHGs.**

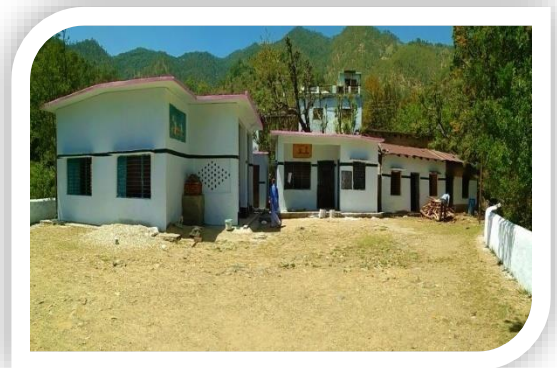

SBI GramSeva was launched in October 2017 as a flagship program by SBI Foundation Mumbai. The implementing partner of Uttarakhand is Sanjeevani Vikas Evam Jan Kalyan Samiti, Ranikhet. The project was implemented in Gram Panchayat Nail comprising of five villages in Almora District. The project is rolled out for next 2 years in a sustainable way and the project is being supported by SBI Foundation.



The project has focused on convergence with the line departments and bank officials considering sustainability and benefits to community on large scale. Hence, two polyhouses worth Rs. 1.00 lakh each has been benefitted on 80% subsidy, farm equipment such as power weeder, chaff cutter and water pipes and water pumps have been provided to the community members as a result of network meetings with the officials.

Sanjeevani is a partner of Fair Climate Network Bangalore. Fair Climate Network stands for Carbon mitigation project across the country. Sanjeevani has been a partner of this network from 2013. And our organization has completed Ten thousand house hold survey for the purpose. There are three organizations from Uttarakhand for the purpose and we have registered our project from Gold Standard Foundation. In the first phase, along with the support of **Integra Micro Systems (P) Ltd**, we have distributed smokeless woodstoves in the villages. This project will not only for carbon mitigation but it will also work as pro poor in the basis of carbon credit. Our main component is smokeless woodstove. In present context we have been working with **1550 HHSS**.

Sanjeevani has been executing Oak Tasar Project in Kapkot development block of Bageshwar district. This program is supported by Directorate of Sericulture Deharadun under guidance of Central Silk Board, Bangalore. This program is being executed for the upliftment and livelihood creation for tribal families through oak tasar and silk worm. Sanjeevani has identified 325 tribal families for the program.

In financial year 2019-20, Sanjeevani have implemented many activities. Implemented activities are as follows;

1. Nursery Establishment Workshop: Sanjeevani has imparted Nursery establishment workshop at village level. In this financial year Sanjeevani organised 10 workshops for tribal families.
2. Afforestation Work: Sanjeevani has done afforestation work in 70 HA land with 58000 plants (Oak plants).
3. Rearing shed construction for Silk Worm: For keeping Silk worm, we have constructed 18 rearing sheds for silk worm generation. Sanjeevani has done hatching work for egg production as well.

Rajput Convent School was established by Sanjeevani Organisation in gram Kafra, Development Block Dwarahat, District Almora in 2003. In present context Class LKG to Class 8th is running in the School. The main objectives of the School are to impart a modern education to the promising kids of the rural areas with modern techniques. One more main objective of the school is to generate employment for the educated youth of the areas. In the school, classes from LKG to 8th are being executed and school is approved from Education department. About 480 kids are taking education in the school.

Sanjeevani is a non-government social organization, registered under Societies Registration Act 21, 1860, in the year 2000. Sanjeevani is already under 12AA, 80G, FCRA and meets all the government compliances every year. Sanjeevani works on multiple themes in social development sectors like education, health, environment, livelihood, rural development, and other areas of development.

SANJEEVANI has been working in partnership with the Government, Corporate and foreign agencies and running nearly about 10 projects every year. So far, we have accomplished 70 long terms projects since inception. Sanjeevani also has carried out the project in collaboration with local partners for livelihood activities in Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

Our foot prints in social development activities have touched the lives of **49,000 families** (children, women, youth, and men), **49,600 farmers** covering nearly about **1200 Gram Panchayats**, and **2480 villages** in various districts of Uttarakhand.

Sanjeevani has been continually engaged in bringing success to the people and community focusing on the real outcome as expected and meeting the needs of the people at grass root level.

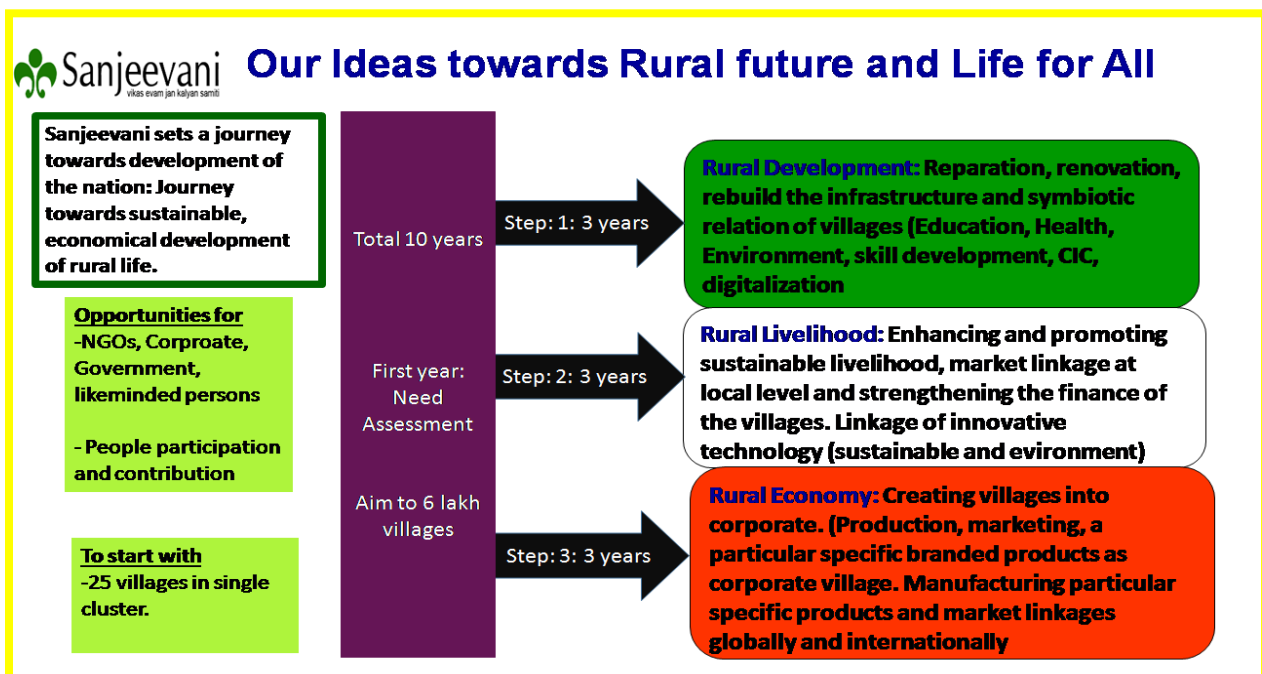
Innovative Project Two: Improving primary health care services in the rural regions of Uttarakhand through Mobile Medical Clinic.

Sanjeevani aim is to bring Mobile Medical Clinic and improve primary health care services in the rural areas of Uttarakhand. We help provide a cost-effective and compassionate solution to the unavailability of sufficient health-care rural population. Mobile health clinics will deliver health care services directly to a population who are unable to access the basic health services.

The basis of our proposal is designed for Mobile Medical Clinic and support a major concern of public health to all and convenient accessibility at the time of emergencies. We have designed the project where doctors, health professionals and social workers to deliver health care as well as social services to rural population. At the mobile clinic, every person will have access to much needed primary care services, and Covid 19 protection kits after checkups and even health assistance at the time of emergencies.

Innovative Project Three: Inclusive Sustainable Livelihood development for Small & Marginal Farmers, Rural Women and Disabled persons

This project objective is to enhance the sustainable livelihood opportunities of Small & Marginal Farmers, Rural Women, Person with disabilities in the State Uttarakhand. The project focus would be on the development of livelihood and enhance local GDP. Community-based inclusive groups (CBIGs) will be formed including people with disabilities and other marginalized people includes widow, parents of a person with disabilities, backward, SC/ST and other excluded community members including BPL persons. This phase intervention would help for Identification of PRIs/government resources and schemes in the productive sector (Animal husbandry, Agriculture, Dairy, Horticulture, Local trained, and skilled persons, etc.). Linking persons with disabilities and other vulnerable section with social securities and schemes.



Life Changing Stories - 1

The possibility of the dream gives strength

Kavita, a shy and introvert woman, was born 28 years ago with locomotive disability. She is not able to use one of her legs. She receives disability pension of Rs.1000 per month. Her husband has a private job at Ramnagar and he is quite supportive towards her in all respects. She always dreamt of opening a tailor shop but due to financial and other constraints she could not do it. She is a housewife and before coming in contact with Sanjeevani she used to spend most of her time taking care her children and doing household chores.



The luck took a turn when Sanjeevani staff visited Kavita's village for conducting a survey during one of our project. Sanjeevani contacted Kavita and explained the benefits that project was supporting people. She was quite impressed with the objectives of the program and wanted to associate with it. She expressed her desire to open a tailor shop. Sanjeevani arranged a three months training for her. After completion of training, she started working from home. After some time with the help of her husband and continuous support from Sanjeevani she opened a shop in Daighat, which is 4 km from her village Palpur. In the shop she also sells cosmetic items. In order to equip her shop with racks and furniture she took a loan of Rs.1,00,00 from the community based inclusive group (CBIG) of which she is a member. Sanjeevani also provided her a sewing machine.



The life of Kavita is now completely changed. She is a self-dependent woman with a source of income of her own. The shop has benefited her in two ways- she can take her kids to school with her and also earn something. She earns about Rs.400-Rs.500 every day from these occupations in addition to the disability pension that she receives from the government. She also works as a master trainer for Sanjeevani. She has joined 'Tarkeshwar Mahadev CBIG' a community-based inclusive group. Kavita gives us a lesson that dreams are whispers of our ambitions, which guide us in the right direction and our actions are the means of transportation to achieve them.



Life Changing Stories - 2

Nothing succeeds like success



Kailash Chandra Gairola is the only brother of four sisters. One of his sister Savitri Devi, is intellectually disabled and could not take care of herself. After the death of his father in his childhood, Kailash could not continue his studies and he shifted himself to Delhi to earn for his family. He worked as a labourer and sometimes worked for 15 hours a day. Due to these hard facts of life struggle, he fell ill and came back to his village. He tried to set up a shop but failed and lost his investment. He was un-employed, his mother was ill and he had to take care of his sister who was intellectually disabled along with providing for his wife and children. Though he had enough land, he was not

able to earn more than what was needed for meeting the requirement of his own family. Sanjeevani met Kailash at this point of life. Kailash was given training on organic vegetable cultivation. Sanjeevani also supported him with a 600 ft.² Poly house and a compost pit. The agriculture specialist from Sanjeevani provided him hands on training on techniques like land preparation, seed selection, seed sowing, weeding, plant protection and mulching. He meticulously used all these techniques in his poly house as well as in his fields. He sowed high yielding varieties suggested by the specialist.

Kailash is now a successful farmer cultivating vegetables like capsicum, tomatoes, ginger, carrots and pumpkin. He sells his produce in the local market. Last year he sold a produce worth Rs.75,000 from his poly house only. Kailash has become a talk of the town due to his improved practices and enhanced productivity. He has become a master trainer for many other farmers who follow his advice and try to learn his methods. His income has increased manifold and he is able to save for his family. He has equipped his poly house with all facilities. All this has brought a positive result in the lives of his family members as well. His sister Savitri Devi has started helping him in his daily chores. Due to this success the government also provided him with a water tank which is useful for the drip irrigation system that he is using in his poly house.



Life Changing Stories - 3

Never dream a success, work together with your heart

Kailash Singh Rawat was a government teacher but his heart was always in farming, growing cash crops and earning livelihood from it. He listened to his heart and realized this so he quit his job of government teacher. He worked hard on this land and turned it into a fertile farm. However, after a couple of years a tragedy struck in the form of hail storm which devastated his crops. Since he invested money after taking it on interest he was indebted heavily. Though he was discouraged, but his determination made him face this adversity head-on.



He came to know about the government scheme Pradhan Mantri Sanrakshana Yojana (PMSY) to promote agriculture among marginal farmers. With his efforts he got a poly house. This poly house covered six nalis of his land. Within one season he realized that this poly house was not built as per scientific norms. The cost of this poly house was Rs.10,00,00 out of which he himself had invested around 2,57,000. Since the poly house was not as per standards so his investment resulted in a waste. As a result, his debt increased. However, he didn't lose hope and kept on convincing the government department to rectify this problem. These efforts resulted in getting a few exhaust fans for this poly house. Though some improvement happened but the problem didn't resolve completely.

Sanjeevani advised him on the kind of crops he could grow and the techniques he could follow to increase his production. He received training on new techniques of farming. He got these trainings in Indo- Israel Centre at Karnal and Pusa Institute in Delhi. On training



and support, Kailash started treatment of his soil which resulted in an increase in his production and profit. He also equipped his poly house with facilities like drip irrigation etc. With all these measures his total debt of Rs.10,00,000 decreased. Last year he grew capsicum and earned a profit of Rs.30,000. Now he has increased his area of production by leasing land from villagers who do not tend their land. By Changing Nothing, Nothing Changes



Harish Kumar lives with her wife Devaki and son Mayank in Ghangoli village of Chukhutiya block. When he was still infant he had a paralytic attack but his parents could not realize it. Later, they consulted the doctor who confirmed that he had paralytic attack impaired his left side. As this tragedy was not enough he faced continuous exclusion during his school days. He confronted comments based on his physical condition. His father was a mason but since the work was not enough in the village so the income was not regular. He married to Devaki who is also a disabled person but she supports him in his endeavors

with all her strength. His younger brother, who is working in Delhi, also supports the family. Harish and Devaki receive Divyang pension of Rs.2000 per month. Harish always wanted to be a self- dependent person but he never got an opportunity or support to realize this dream.

Harish got an opportunity to share his dream with someone who was ready to listen. Harish selected the option if he is given a chance Rs.10,000/- in cash, a car or an opportunity to earn a decent livelihood wherein an official from CBM India Trust asked. Harish opted for third option as this was the only way to ensure sustained income. Sanjeevani provided him continuous counseling, motivation and orientation. After few meetings, Harish decided to start goat rearing as he didn't own any land. He had a good knowledge of local fodder and experience of animal husbandry. Sanjeevani also provided him three young goats and a 15 days training on animal husbandry from Pooran Singh of Chaukhutiya.

Today Harish has 10 goats, out of which six are female and four are male. He has already sold two male goats and earned Rs.8000. It was his first income ever so he was very excited and happy. His future plan is to own a herd of about hundred goats.

The story of Harish teaches us that Man cannot discover new oceans unless he has the courage to lose sight of the shore.




