# About Sanjeevani organization



Sanjeevani Vikas Evam Jan Kalyan Samiti, is known as Sanjeevani in the state of Uttarakhand, Ranikhet, is a registered development organization working in the rural and hilly regions of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh states of India. Sanjeevani got registered in the year 2000 as a non-government social organization under Societies Registration Act 21, 1860. Sanjeevani has tax exemption certificates registered under 12A, and 80G. We have also registered and received CSR Form 1 under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs to receive corporate funds under CSR. Sanjeevani is also registered under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) and fulfill all the government compliances every year. Sanjeevani works on multiple themes in social development sectors like education, health, environment, livelihood, rural development, and other areas of development.

SANJEEVANI has been working in partnership with the Government, Corporate, International and renowned foreign agencies and running nearly about 10 projects every year.

So far, we have accomplished 78 long terms projects since inception. Sanjeevani also has carried out the project in collaboration with local partners for livelihood activities in other states as well.

Our footprints in social development activities have touched the lives of 78000 families (children, women, youth, and men), 35000 farmers covering nearly about 1216 Gram Panchayats, and 2569 villages in various districts in the states of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh.

We have also equally focused on various other themes like education, health, environment, skill development, water conservation, sanitation, safe drinking water, child protection and others like the capacity building of rural women, formation of SHGs, health issues of women & children, child protection, and financial inclusion.

## Our Achievements/Outcomes

Sanjeevani has undertaken around 78 long term projects in collaboration with various cooperate, funding agencies, government agencies and international agencies. Sanjeevani has notable achievements based on our thematic areas which are listed below;

## Integrated Rural Development

Rural development focused on an integrated approach with people's participation. We have collaborated with SBI as part of CSR initiatives. We have shown great results for the community. Currently, 5 villages are adopted for the integrated development of the villages (health, education, infrastructure development, livelihood, digitalization, skill development, environment activities, linking government schemes etc).



- ▶ **For vulnerable sections and persons with disabilities**, we have formed 370 Community Based Inclusive Groups (CBIGs) and 4 Disabled People Organizations (DPOs) in Uttarakhand. We also have formed 250 SHG group members for livelihood and small business activities. Under Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay–Self Reliant Community, we are covering 1700 vulnerable and marginals and 300 persons with disabilities, to mainstream them to livelihood and ensure the rehabilitation facilities in the targeted blocks of Dehradun.
- ▶ Under HDFC's Focused Development Program, we are emphasizing on modern techniques of agriculture and horticulture, for the support of **value addition of 2000 apple and vegetable growers, particularly** Small farmers of Mandi district, Himachal Pradesh.
- ▶ **Animal Welfare (Equine care project)** with the support of The Donkey's Sanctuary of 500 people through the promotion of Azolla cultivation and planning for their enhanced livelihood and increased income.
- ▶ We have catered the livelihood initiatives to **35000 Families** in various trades of farm & non-farm activities.



- ▶ We have catered the **livelihood initiatives to 35,000 farmers** and have formed a strong network of Farmers' Groups and Farmers Producers Organizations. As livelihood and skill development activities, we have provided skills to unemployed/ uneducated youth and various skills in linking them with local skill training academy which is certified by the government. **1800 youth and women are given various skill training** so far. We are also continually working on financial literacy campaigns in the districts of Uttarakhand.
- ▶ **Afforestation:** A huge plantation has been done under the Oak Tasar program. The program is being implemented for the upliftment and **livelihood creation of tribal families** in the Bageshwar district.
- ▶ We are also continually working on financial literacy campaign in the districts of Uttarakhand to enhance and promote better livelihood.
- ▶ In livelihood, we have emphasized modern techniques of agriculture and horticulture, Organic agriculture, cash crops and others. We have collaborated with NABARD, Banks and other financial institutions for business startup initiatives.



- ▶ Organization imparted 220 Sustainable Livelihood Trainings on various trades of farm and non-farm trades. 4976 number of persons have started to earn their livelihood Income. Out of which 257 have become Master Trainers and executing their livelihood and working as business entity and at the same time they have started imparting training to others. 135 Master trainers have become Resource Person & imparted training in their area and associated with other programmes also.
- ▶ We have gone extra mile to expand our horizon by forming 4 Farmers Producers Organizations. Now Farmers have come under formed FPOs umbrella. Farmers have started their sale through FPOs. These new borne FPOs will work as business entity very soon in upcoming time.
- ▶ Afforestation: A huge plantation has done under Oak Tasar program. The program is being implemented for the upliftment and livelihood creation of tribal families in Bageshwar district
- ▶ As part of skill development activities, we have provided skills to unemployed/uneducated youth, women and men with various skills in linking them with local skill training academy which is certified by government. As livelihood and skill development activities, we have provided skills to unemployed/uneducated youth various skills in linking them with local skill training academy which is certified by government. 1800 youth and women are given various skill training so far.



## Education



- ▶ In the past, in association with Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, New Delhi, we have accomplished the program in imparting the knowledge on science and technology in the government schools. We also organized national Science congress program to facilitate this program. There were nearly about 1500 students participated in this initiatives.
- ▶ In education, we are currently working on **Community Based Inclusive Development Initiatives (Persons with Disabilities)**. The objective is to increase accessibility to education for children with disabilities; developing communities for inclusion and provision of specific services for persons with disabilities where required.
- ▶ Sanjeevani established one school namely Rajput Convent School in Present context, class **LKG to class 8th** is running in the school. The main objective of the school is to impart a good and modern education to local kids in reasonable prices with modern techniques.
- ▶ We have focused on the Computer education, smart education and remedial classes of village kids and students under SBI Gram Seva. 5 Computer classes, 5 smart classes and 5 Remedial classes from Primary level to Intermediate has been organized through the year in SBI Gram Seva intervention area.
- ▶ **4 students got scholarship** under SBI Gram Sevaprogramme in various activities namely education, Sports & cultural activities. Per year each student received the scholarship amount of **INR. 20,000.00**. One of the scholarship children along with their team received **1st prize** in cultural activities at EGAAS Mahotsav in District Pauri.
- ▶ **Shiv Nadar Foundation and HCL has signed a MoU** with Sanjeevani for **VidyaGyan Program**. Meritorious students from rural and urban, economically underprivileged communities who fulfill the eligibility criteria at VidyaGyan-one of India's top residential schools established under the aegis of Shiv Nadar Foundation and HCL. With this initial step, 6 children have selected in VidyaGyan school campus.





## Sanjeevani has undertaken various projects in health care initiatives which are briefed as listed below;

- ▶ Sanjeevani has been executing The Hunger Project in development block Takula, district Almora (Uttarakhand). This project aims to support every woman, man and child leads a healthy, fulfilling life of self-reliance and dignity. We are working 51 gram panchayats with 240 Elected Women Representatives.
- ▶ Sanjeevani has partnered with Leo & Mia Foundation to improve the health care facilities of preterm /Maternal and children and for their well-being in Uttarakhand & Himachal Pradesh State, India.
- ▶ We have worked with JalSansthan Ranikhet for total Sanitation Campaign Project. The main aim of the programme is to make hundred per cent sanitation in targeted gram panchayats. After getting hundred per cent sanitation there was a provision for getting Nirmal Gram Award. We made two gram panchayat Nirmal Gram. One Gram Panchayat is Dalmori from Development Block Bhikyasen and another Chekkelani from Syaldey development block. Both gram panchayats already awarded with Nirmal Gram Award by then Hon. President of India.
- ▶ We also have undertaken sanitation project supported by World bank through the State of Uttarakhand. The programme indicates for Uttarakhand Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Project.
- ▶ We have worked on AIDS and HIV intervention in association Uttarakhand State AIDS Control Society Dehradun. Sanjeevani has worked as a partner NGO in Bageshwar district exclusively on Female Sex Workers for 3 years.
- ▶ Sanjeevani has worked on tuberculosis awareness and testing of patients in partnership with RNTCP (Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme) is the second largest national programme in the country.

- ▶ We have organized a Pre-Conception-Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Workshop in Vikas Bhawan Hall, District Bageshwar in association with Garuda Advertisement Agency New Delhi for the district level workshop. The programme was funded and guided by Directorate of Health and Family Welfare, Uttarakhand Government.
- ▶ Organization has renovated one Health Centre in SBI Gram Seva intervention area and made functional non-functional health center. And started one baby delivery Centre in association with District Health Department. A great boom is seeing after the reopening of Baby Delivery Centre.
- ▶ We organize health camps in the rural hilly areas with support of local government, District collector, Corporates and others based on the project interventions.





## Environment activities



- ▶ Sanjeevani is the partner of Fair Climate Network Bangalore for a Carbon mitigation project across the country. And our organization has completed 10,000 household surveys for this purpose. For the same, Sanjeevani has registered our project from Gold Standard Foundation. In the first phase, we initiated the distribution of Smokeless Woodstove. We are connected with 1550 End Users family.
- ▶ Our organization has executed the Climate Change Campaign and the Pan-Our organization has executed the Climate Change Campaign and the Panchayats Election Campaign with CASA in association with Mountain Collective Forum. Our organization has executed Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) in the gram panchayat of Bageshwar under the DFO Office/Member Secretary, IWMP Bageshwar. We have been working on Watershed Management Program in the hill regions.



- ▶ Sanjeevani carries out every year tree plantation in the hilly forest regions along with the local community. We have planted 1.42 lakh more plants last year for all the projects.
- ▶ Sanjeevani has rejuvenated the water sources, trenches, and water conservation and drinking water facilities.

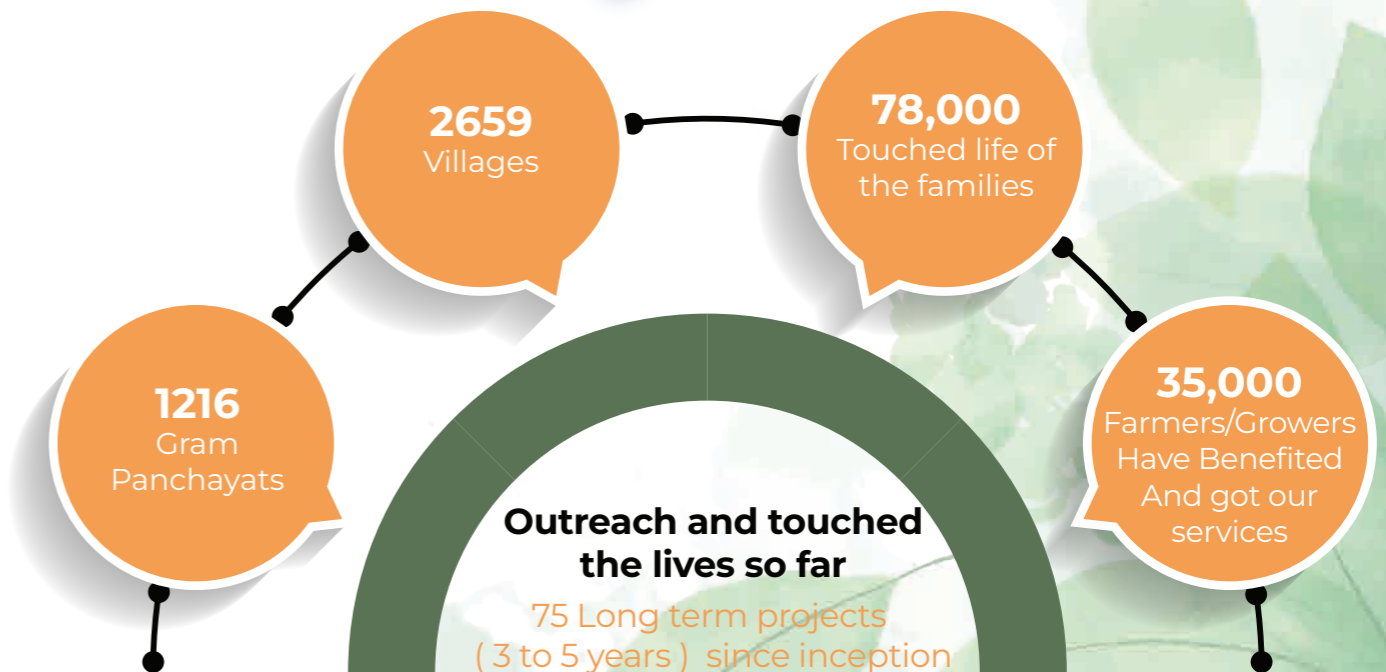
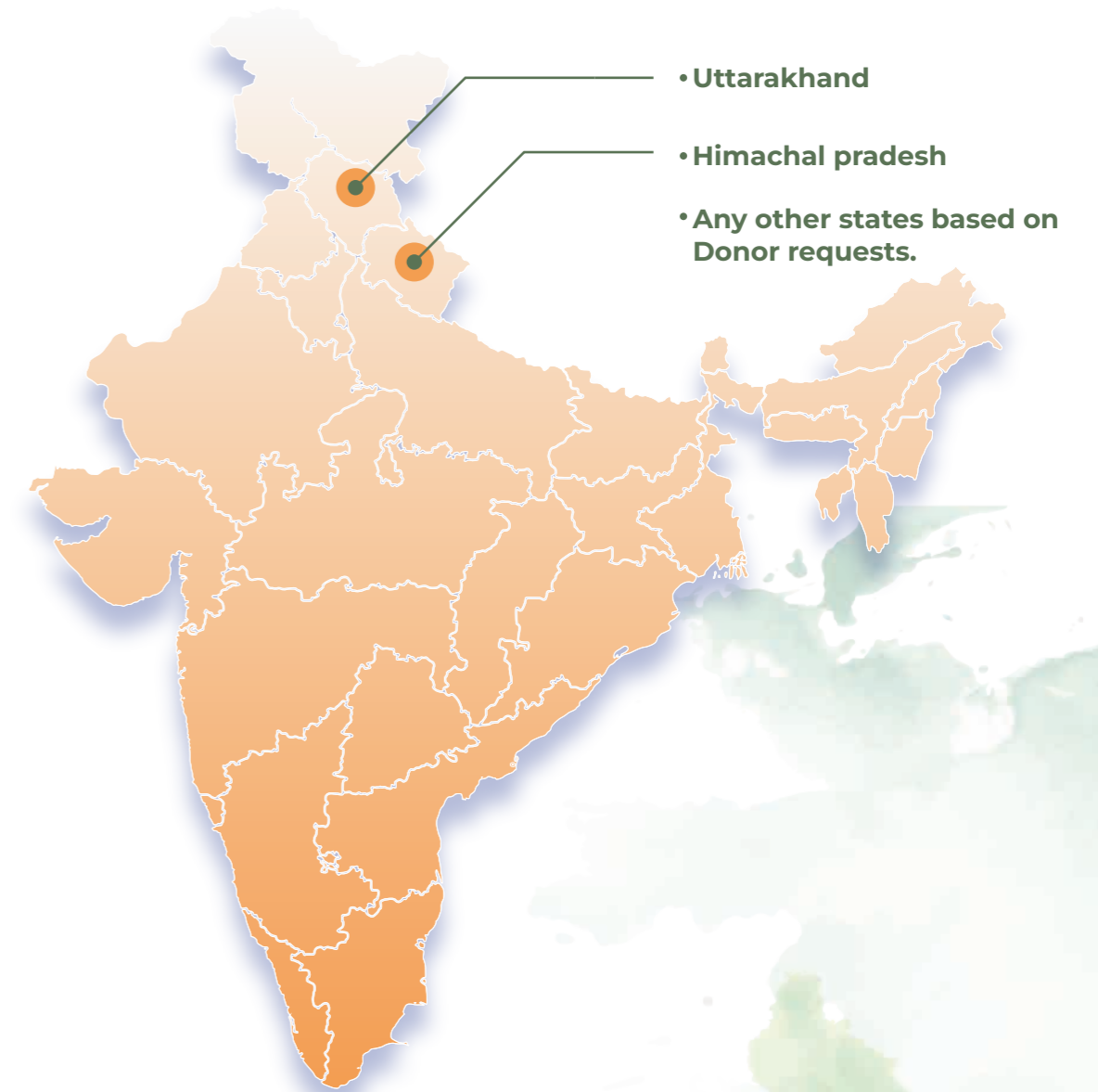


Working with Children and Women



- ▶ Sanjeevani runs child helpline in collaboration with Childline India Foundation. We are working in the entire districts for child rights and child protection. We have covered **4953 children, 3675 adults and 2100 stakeholders.**
- ▶ Sanjeevani has been executing **The Hunger Project** in development block Takula, district Almora (Uttarakhand). This project aims to support every elected woman representative to be empowered with PRIs fund function and functionalities concept fulfilling life of self-reliance and dignity. We have worked with **51 gram panchayats** with **251 Elected Women Representatives.**
- ▶ Sanjeevani has formed Self Help Groups (SHGs) for women. We have nearly about **250 SHGs.**

► In association with HDFC Bank CSR Parivartan, Sanjeevani Vikas Evam Jan Kalyan Samiti is implementing the project "Focused Development Project (FDP)". The project is operational in 61 villages of 5-gram panchayats with the notion to create horticulture added value for small apple growers and vegetable farmers with an integrated development approach. It's a three-year project that started in April 2021. The aim of the project is to provide a sustainable livelihood for the growers reciting in the gram panchayats and has been working with nearly 2017 growers. Establishing a sustainable social enterprise is the core of the project.

► Initially, there was an existence of middle man in the intervention area. It was the only source for growers to sell the agri-products resulting into the exploitation and lesser prices.

Earlier the technology used in agriculture was traditional and old leading to high input cost and hampering the profit of growers. Thus, the project emphasis on to enhance the livelihood of selected growers through empowerment and competitiveness of Farmers Interest Groups and formation of Farmer Producer organization by supporting access to knowledge, technology and finance in order to increase long term productivity and increased incomes in an environment marked by changing market patterns and increased climate variability for apple and vegetable cultivation. The project also supports the interventions designed to help the horticulture sector, improve productivity and to improve market access through incentives for apple and vegetable growers to cater the market needs. Project activities focuses on resolving the binding constraints on productivity, quality, value-addition and market linkages.

### A. Environment and Clean Energy

To promote the environment and clean energy, 140 solar street lights were planted in 59 villages of 5-gram panchayats based on the requirements. The installation of lights has impacted 6966 individuals directly and 1089 individuals indirectly. Consequently, it has reduced man-animal conflict as the animals ruin the crop less because of the lights and there is less destruction of crops in fields. Furthermore, the connecting paths are well lit providing villagers with an opportunity to open their shops till late in the evening. For the houses in solitude and near forest stretch can freely move around in their premises at the dark and rainy season resulting in lesser accidents. Light also allowed growers to work in the fields until dark, feel safe and secure, and return home, ultimately earning a living.



## B. Sustainable Community Institution Building

To create sustainable community institutions, 50 Farmers Interest Groups have been formed to serve 2017 farmers. Orientation and training programs were in place to address issues such as the presence of middlemen, lack of access to modern farming practices, ways to reduce input costs, and soil health management. The training was held with his 1,379 growers on crop management and protection and 881 growers to share their knowledge on apple value creation. During the crop management and protection training session, the team discussed soil fertility, soil and seed treatment, field preparation, seeding/planting, training and pruning, tillage and weeding. The team also provided information on Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and Integrated Phytonutrient Management (IPNM), harvesting, packaging and grading. Growers were motivated to use a scientific approach to agriculture to increase yields and improvise production. In addition, growers gained knowledge about value creation and the processes involved.

Knapsack power sprayers were also distributed to producers to reduce input costs. Proper control of bacteria, fungi, and pests used to be difficult, but power sprayers have made the job easier and time-saving for growers.

A three-day exposure visit was organized to improve skills and provide hands-on experience and on-site training. During exposure visits, apple orchard farmers learned about nutritional management, pest control, fungal management, and bacterial management. They also gained knowledge about disease management and best practices for apple tree training and pruning.



## C. Formation of Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) and Market Linkage

To provide sustainable community ventures and break the monopoly of middlemen, FPO was formed under the name "The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd." operating under the brand name "Himachal Farming Working with Nature". FPO trades fresh apples and by-products i.e., Apple cider vinegar, ready-to-drink juices, concentrated juice and apple jam. In the fiscal year 2021/22, approximately 11,500 kilograms of apples were procured across the 403 members of the 10 FIGs. In addition, growers have sold about 2,700 kilograms of fresh apples through this project. During the financial year, his newly established FPO made transactions worth Rs.3,00,751.





#### D. Soil Health Management for vegetable and apple cultivation

Soil health management is an important part of agriculture and forms the basis of crops, productivity and fertilizers. Growers were unable to undergo soil testing due to the unavailability of soil testing labs in the region. The project not only made growers aware of important aspects of soil health management but also provided an opportunity to test their soil. Activities were held with the Convergence of Agriculture Department. Based on the Soil Health Report, organic liquid NPK (Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium) was distributed along with PSB to solubilize phosphorus and PMB to mobilize potassium to initiate the trend of organic farming from an ecological point of view. They were all part of IPNM.



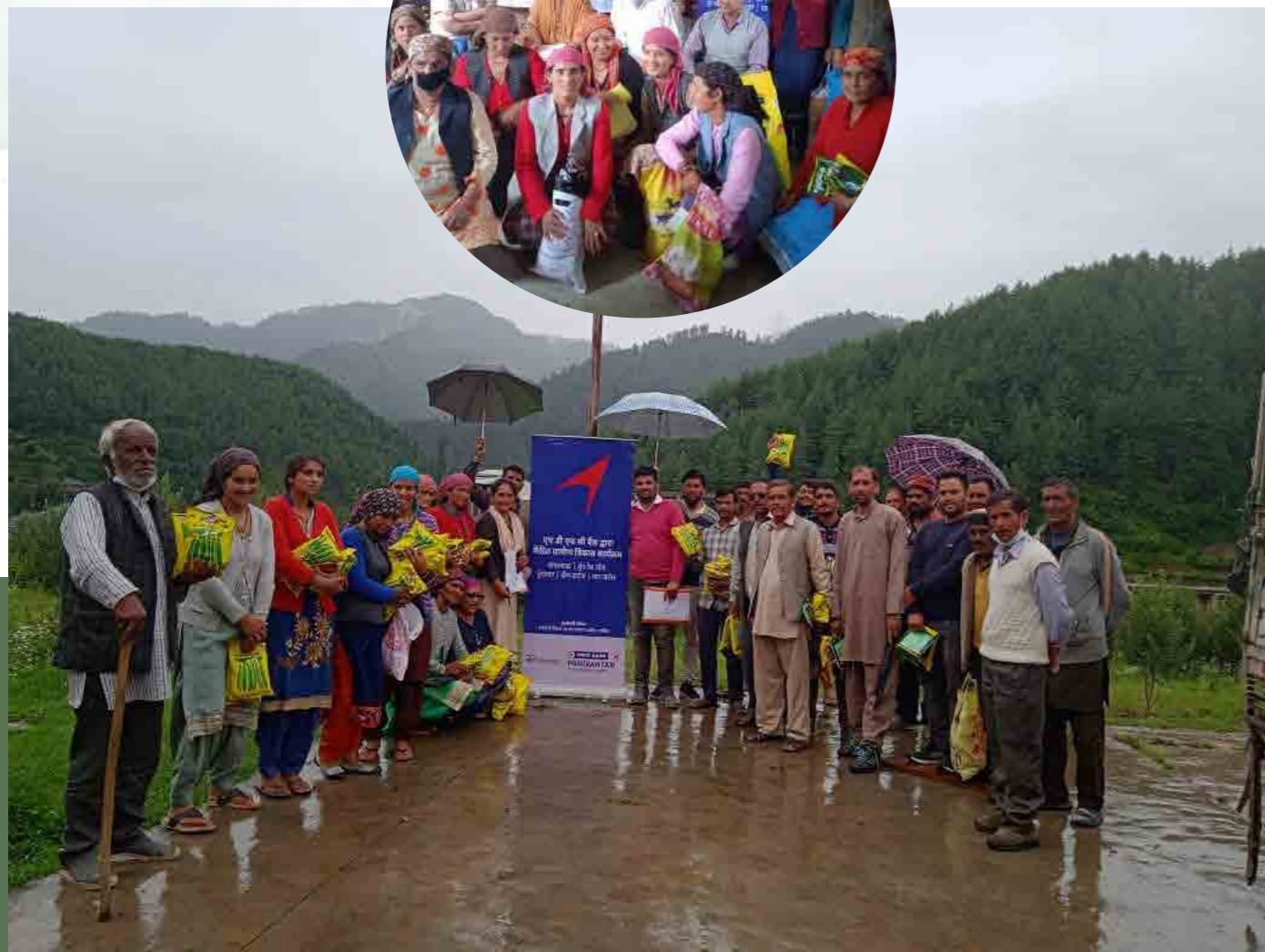
#### E. New Apple Orchard Development

In recent years, the primary industry has developed and scientifically advanced technology has been introduced. Several new high-yielding varieties have been introduced to make agriculture and horticulture more profitable. The aim is to increase the quality and quantity of productivity. To achieve the same goal and secure a livelihood, four seedlings were distributed to all FIG members and an orchard was developed with 50% community contribution. In 1926 the members fell into an orchard development. Nine apple varieties such as Gala, King roat, Jaromine, Red Rum Gala and Red Velox were procured and distributed. They were also given pollinizers to improve the quality of orchards. Through this project, quality seedlings are now available to support the income of small and marginal farmers.

## F. High yield varieties vegetable cultivation

Peas are one of the most important commercial cash crops in the region. The grower plants peas twice a year, but recent climate conditions have reduced productivity. This project therefore assisted breeders with high-yielding seed varieties. New species cultivars were introduced. In terms of germination rates, the newly proven cultivars performed better than the previous cultivars in the region.

The intervention has impacted about 1,386 growers who received high-yielding cultivar seeds, of which about 598 growers received pea seeds for demonstration.



## G. Establishment of Processing Unit

A model processing unit has been established to make the project sustainable in the long term and to create ownership between producers. Before the intervention, HPMC was the only reliable source for growers to sell 'C' grade apples. However, the grower faced challenges with HPMC regarding payments. Additionally, it was a one-time sale with no ownership of the final product.

To address this issue, the unit He was established in 2021 and began purchasing grade 'C' apples to process and manufacture by-products such as juices, jams and vinegar. Now, growers don't have to wait long as payments are made to their accounts within 15 days. The unit is also based on a community venture model, where producers benefit from backward and forward links, owning their own brand and ownership while creating more livelihood opportunities for locals. In its first year of operation, the unit saved him 1,450 litres of concentrated juice, 1,800 litres of apple cider vinegar, and 90 kg. Jam and almost 1800 kg of pulp.



## Project Achievements:

The community enterprises have been the major highlight of the project. The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd. is the first cooperative in the area introduced. Before April 2021, the growers of Seraj block faced so many challenges. They have a horticulture-based economy but the major issue was of high input cost and lack of market linkages, decreasing the profit. Lack of modern technology and scientific techniques of farming along with the existence of middlemen were other challenges. To cater the challenges community institution and enterprise was established. The Farmers Interest Groups (FIGs) was first initiative to collectivize growers and make it into one voice. Through FIGs modern technology and scientific techniques were introduced. Later, all 50 FIGs were brought under one umbrella i.e., FPO as a business entity. A commercial website has also developed for marketing purposes.



## Feedback by Beneficiaries:

35 years old, Pushp Raj from Chadohinal village, Bungrail Chowk learned to grow apples from his father and has since continued his work. In his interview, he said that he produces around 100 to 150 boxes (approximately 2500 to 3750 kg) of apples in favourable weather conditions. He also mentioned that earlier he used to sell his A and B Grade apples through middlemen and his C Grade apples to HPMC (Himachal Pradesh Horticulture Produce Marketing and Processing Corporation Limited). HPMC was the sole buyer of C Grade apples, but the challenge with them was the price. Pushp Raj explained that instead of giving them cash at times, HPMC has given agricultural inputs such as seeds and fertilizers without even considering their agricultural needs. "We gave up hope of getting money for C-Grade Apples, but we had no other choice. C Grade apple was pretty wasteful." He said that he approached the team through the Farmer Interest Group to sell out his C-grade apples. "The team came to us to buy C-grade apples and said that payment for them would be in our account within a week. We were both happy and sceptical. But after receiving my first payment, I felt assured and happy."

**Project Summary:**

SBI Gram Seva was launched in October 2017 as a flagship program by SBI Foundation and partnered with Sanjeevani in the state of Uttarakhand. Sanjeevani implemented the project in Nail Gram Panchayat comprising of five villages in Almora district. The project was successfully completed on September 2020. After the successful completion of the first phase of the project, the work of the second phase of SBI Gram Seva Sustainability is being implemented from October 2020. In the first phase of the project, for 3 years, Sanjeevani carried out infrastructural development, and community institution building in villages, implementing the major components and activities have been successfully worked on digitalisation, education, networking, environmental protection, infrastructure facilities, sanitation, health, livelihood promotion, convergence of government schemes and services, capacity building and community awareness and strengthening the unity of the community towards sustainable development of the villages through integrated approach.

### Project Interventions:

SBI Gram Seva approach has brought more development perspectives among community people and increased their participation and experience in terms of self-reliance. Further sustainability and functioning of core activities by community; Sanjeevani along with SBI Foundation support has formed groups and committees from each village level and has been federated in to gram panchayat level during these three of project duration. During this process, Sanjeevani has continuously informed the villagers and committee members after 3 years, the people should continue to undertake all the activities and particularly the core activities for the welfare and development of the villages. Sanjeevani has handed over the project to the community and engaged them and given responsibility to sustain this project outcomes and impacts from the beginning of the project. Sanjeevani focused on the sustainable activities at the villages focusing on each component of the interventions.

### Activity one: Community Based organization

To ensure continuous operation of the activities of Mahila-Mangal Dal and Village Development Committees, a community based organization formed in the five villages (Nail, Malli-Bakhali, Thadidhar, Gagnaula, Jairaj) by Sanjeevani under the Gram seva project.



### Interventions:

#### Women and VDC Groups:

Under the community-based organization formed in five villages during the first phase of the Gram Seva Project, 154 members in MahilaMangal Dal and 60 members in village development committees are parts of it.

#### Trainings and Meetings:

To strengthen the women organizations and village development committees, we have organized orientation meetings and various trainings every month focusing on project activities where their participation in the project was required to be implemented at village level. They are also required to advise the villagers on project activities and help them make their own decisions and completion of tasks at the village level. We have conducted 60 meetings for MMDs and 10 training programs with VDCs.

## Activity two: Education:

Continuous operation of remedial classes set up in the five villages to enhance the quality of education and community participation.



### Interventions:

#### School improvement activities

Sanjeevani has been continuously engaged and strengthened the local schools where the infrastructure and digitalization process has been done. Along Gram panchayat committee, we ensured that the infrastructures are maintained and the computers are functional. The digital teaching methods are carried out regularly. The School management committee was highly cooperative along with Gram Panachat committee.

#### Remedial classes and community participation

Sanjeevani has been continuously engaged and strengthened the local schools where the infrastructure and digitalization process has been done. Along Gram panchayat committee, we ensured that the infrastructures are maintained and the computers are functional. The digital teaching methods are carried out regularly. The School management committee was highly cooperative along with Gram Panachat committee.

## Activity Three: Community Awareness

To make the villagers of the five selected villages of SBI Gram Seva an aware citizen through various awareness programs on important days and coordinate with the government department and take benefits of the government scheme.



### Interventions:

#### Remedial classes and community participation

It was important to strengthen the community people through various community awareness programs. We organized and celebrated important days in all the five villages so that the villagers could be made aware of the important days social initiatives and by networking with government departments, agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, Mudra loans. 32 special awareness camps were organized on child helpline, sports, environment protection and livelihood promotion in which 535 villagers participated.

## Activity Four: Livelihood promotions

Livelihood promotion, being an important component of SBI Gram Seva Project, 25 villagers have been connected this year through Advanced Agriculture, Horticulture, Goat farming and Sewing Center.



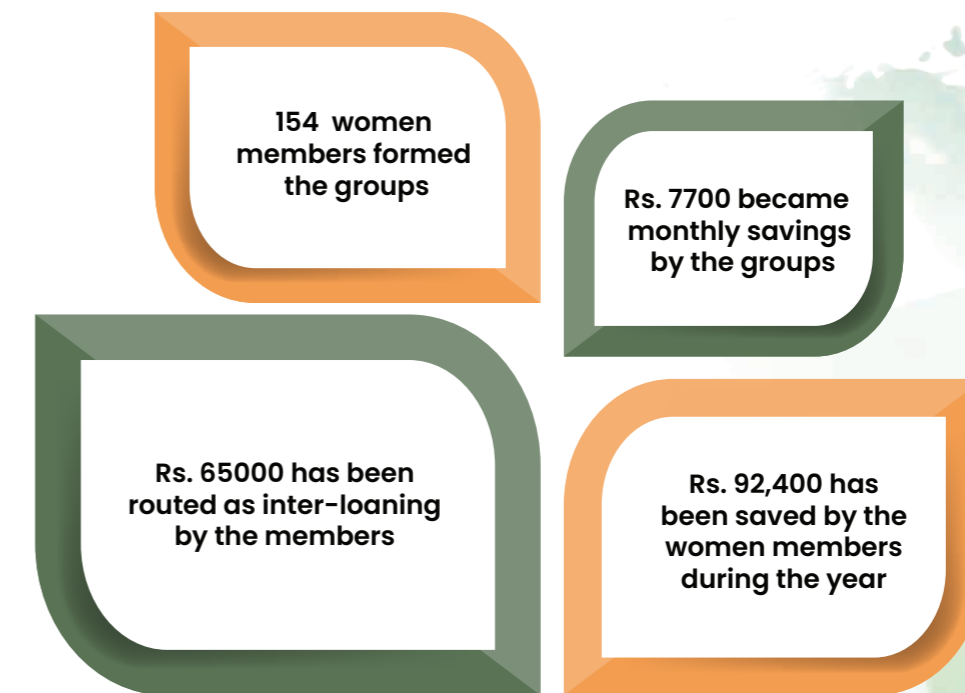
## Interventions:

### Trainings and Meetings

This year, the need for various livelihood-oriented training was felt to all the hard-working and energetic villagers in coordination with the government departments for livelihood promotion so that they could choose their business according to their interest and skill. This year 8 capacity building training programs were organized

## Project Achievements/Outcome:

A. During SBI Gram Seva program, we formed MahilaMangalDals and village development committees in all five villages. After formation of MahilaMangalDals, members took decision to deposit some money on monthly basis. Now there is one automation process, and it is being executed without fail every month. Now they organize their monthly meeting, set their agenda and deposit their monthly contribution and some member's wants to take loan as emergent need, they give in a minimal interest as inter loan. By organizing frequent meetings, training, awareness programs, CBOs today take their own decisions in the village, from time to time and ensure their place by participating in social and livelihood programs, as well as by becoming aware they also take advantage of government schemes which are today be an example to the rest of the community



B. The remedial classes were conducted in all five villages in a smooth way throughout the year. 56 students are enrolled in present time. 12 students took extra classes apart from the remedial classes. The remedial class has always proved to be a milestone for the children of SBI Gram seva. This time also the child expected to do best performance in the domestic and board examinations. Today every child is taking advantage of the learning environment created by remedial classes, which has ensured that parents will get its benefits in future

c. The villagers in the villages got personal benefits on a large scale by organizing awareness programmes. From the awareness program, where they got a chance to get acquainted with new information, on the other hand their reach has increased to the Block Development Office. In which he got Mudra loan to start his own business, made Kisan Credit Card, Ayushman card, e-shram card, crop insurance, animal feed, free / subsidized seeds and agricultural machinery.

Particularly, Sanjeevani will ensure focus on maintenance of all the infrastructures, environment activities, educational activities, and very specifically continue to work on linking various government schemes and services to the villages.

Mr. Dhyan Singh told that, he was progressive farmer but doing his farming work with old and traditional methods. During SBI Gram Seva program, when there was a discussion about modern and scientific farming, he was not ready to give up their traditional methods. After continuous motivational efforts by the team, he took various trainings which enhance his information and his income though new modern farming methods. Now he has started to use high yield variety seeds and sapling in his fields. SBI gram seva team gave their all efforts and linked him with Kisan Credit Card (KCC) and with the help of this KCC he got a poly house with the help of Horticulture Department at 80% subsidy. Now he is getting good income from it.



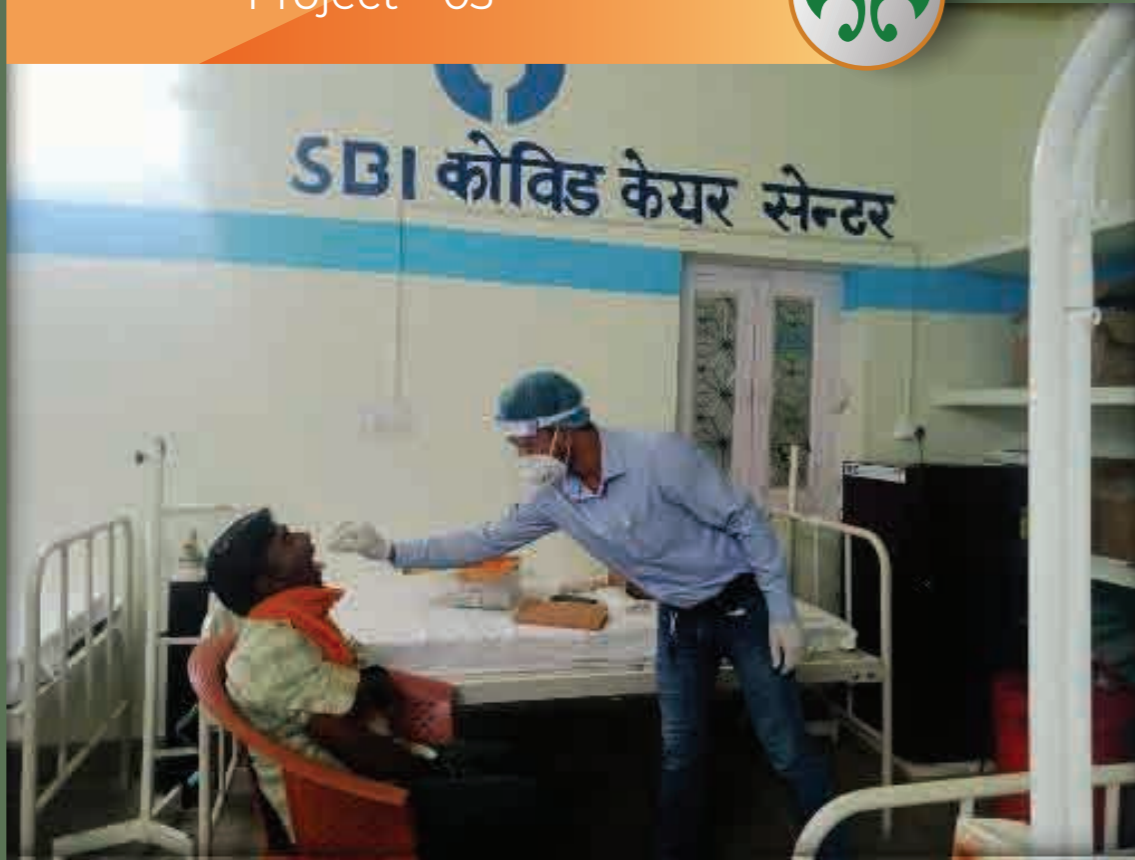

She always says she will be thankful to SBI Foundation, for this sort of empowerment in a remote area and today if they are trying to do something, it's all credits goes to SBI Foundation only.

### Project Summary

The COVID-19 pandemic had an impact on access to healthcare, including a decrease in consultations due to fear of contamination, healthcare workers facing a high-risk of contamination, and difficulties in obtaining medications and medical equipment. Despite all this, Sanjeevani and SBI foundation together was able to act quickly and gradually adapt its emergency response to combat COVID-19 in Almora district the zones of operation in running Covid care centre to reach to the rural population in the hilly regions of Uttarakhand.

COVID-19 emergency: As a leading NGO in the response to the pandemic in Almora District along with SBI Foundation financial support and District Magistrate guidance, Sanjeevani supported the District Health care systems to strengthen COVID-19 Treatment Centers and to train healthcare workers. Sanjeevani set up emergency triage areas at the entrances of supported facilities and trained medical staff in Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures to prevent further spread. Teams provided medical and hospital care to people infected with COVID-19, by deploying 40 ICU beds to treatment centers.

### Project Interventions



The entire India faced humanitarian crisis from 2nd wave of COVID-19 pandemic. The second wave has overwhelmed the healthcare system leaving the hospitals struggling to cope with the shortage of medical essentials. Uttarakhand was not away from this Covid pandemic. Uttarakhand state has 13 districts and Almora district is one of the biggest districts in Uttarakhand, has 11 development blocks. Almora district had only one COVID Care Centre in SSJ Government Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Almora & Attached Governadhan Tiwari Government Base Hospital Almora, which was curing or attending COVID positive cases. Condition was worsening day by day as the nation witnessed the crisis of the pandemic



Sanjeevani with the support of SBI Foundation, established SBI COVID Centre in Development Block Syalde of Almora district, which will decrease dependency of Hospital Almora. This SBI Covidcentre will cater remote villagers to COVID treatment, vaccination and RT PCR testing. Sanjeevani received the local District Magistrate consent as followed the Covid-19 guidelines with the support District Chief Medical officer support and District Healthcare department.



The object of SBI COVID Care centre was to provide health care facilities to mild/asymptomatic COVID patients of SBI Gram Seva Villages by setting up a facility of 40 bedded COVID Care Centre in Almora District of Uttarakhand state.

COVID care interventions was to support the villagers who are identified CORONA positive test and access and retention of CORONA positive people in COVID Care Centre. Community leaders and elders of the targeted areas participation is a must to create an environment that guarantee CORONA positive villagers education in terms of awareness, motivation and the community mobilisation at large.

Sanjeevani established SBI COVID Care Centre in Community Health Centre Deghat after government approval. For the same, Sanjeevani conducted many meetings with District Magistrate Almora, Chief Medical Officer Almora, Chief Development Officer Almora, SDM Syalde and Medical Officer In-Charge, Community Health Centre Deghat. After necessary approval, MOIC, CHC Deghat handed a hospital building to Sanjeevani for the execution of SBI COVID Care Centre. Sanjeevani made assessment of renovation work and start its renovation work. Within 15 days, Sanjeevani completed its renovation work in CHC Deghat and COVID Care centre is fully equipped with Medical Equipment & Consumable items.



To reach to local regions and villages, Sanjeevani conducted awareness and Sensitization Activities. 06 Awareness programmes conducted during the programme where 1257 beneficiaries participated.

The main purpose of the awareness it to create awareness among the community about precautionary measure, CCC facilitation and vaccination also to provide knowledge, change attitudes, commitments to COVID-19 prevention and control.

To provide support for COVID-19 prevention and control.

To reduce the spreading of disease in the village through admitting in CCC.

To facilitate for quick recover of suspect patients in the village through timely & quality treatment.

Sanitizers, masks etc. also distributed during the awareness campaign.

Door to door survey also organized by the Sanjeevani team.



Sanjeevani team visited SBI CCC very closely on daily basis for the smooth operation. Meeting with the staff for updating the records and verified the records of vaccination, RT PCR test and the supervision of stocks (materials). In the final month of the programme, the Covid centre has been handed over with a signed MoU with MOIC, CHC Deghat for the operation & Maintenance of assets for the further functioning and operations. We managed the centre for the period of 6 months. The centre catered its services which resulted into 5084 vaccination and 936 RT PCR testing in the district covering the rural populations.

Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay– Self Reliant Community is The specific project area and location are selected conducted baseline in the selected project area. We have been able to identify 15 to 18 villages in Development blocks Sahaspur and 15 to 18 villages of Dehradun district covering rural, marginalized and vulnerable communities. The objectives of the project is to promote sustainable socio-economic development for 2000 persons with disabilities, family members and other marginalized members in Dehradun districts of the Indian State of Uttarakhand through comprehensive Community Based Inclusive Dehradun, Uttarakhand state. The specific project area and location are selected conducted baseline in the selected project area

**Project Interventions:**

The project started from the month of January 2022, with the objective to reduce poverty and inequality by moving vulnerable households into sustainable livelihoods and toward economic stability mainstream persons with disabilities. The project aim to achieve the expected results.

1. Enhanced the potentiality of Individual by accessing quality comprehensive rehabilitation services appropriate to each individual.
2. Enhanced the economic growth through sustainable livelihood (Livelihood) 4 major components of the livelihood aspects are mushroom cultivation, apiculture (bee-keeping), vegetable farming and goatry.
3. Disability inclusive Farmer Producer Organisation strengthened (Livelihood).
4. Access and inclusion in existing programmes, schemes, policies and institution through combined efforts of OPD, duty bearers and concerned stakeholders is strengthened (Inclusive systems and inclusive communities).
5. Efficient implementation of the project through a strong monitoring & information system established (Project Management).



The aim of this project is to achieve in a large scale, positive changes through economic development or empowerment, and creating opportunities for sustainable livelihood as rights based and social programs that enable disadvantaged and marginalized women and men including person with disabilities so that they can realize their potentiality. To contribute to the promotion of economic empowerment and employment and enhance more supportive involvement in creating smooth livelihood opportunities for person with disabilities and vulnerable people through implementation of this proposed project.

The project has been started with mobilization and strengthened the persons with disabilities and their families and the people from vulnerable section of the society in one network for achieving and resulting in success for employment and accessibilities under livelihood start-up businesses. Their empowerment and economic capacities to business start-ups, accessibility and engaging with public and private sectors in resource building and networking collaboration and coordination mechanism established through project activities (like: participants selection and inclusive group formation, capacity development, Skill trainings, infrastructures development/establishment, agro farm establishment, and linking and connectivity among different agencies, meetings, advocacy events for the creation of enabling environment, socio-economic development policy implementation, workshops for creation on accessibility in public service providers, coordination and dialogue workshop, advocacy workshop with business association and networking collaboration meeting with government and policy level and business growth will be achieved through the this project intervention. The proposed changes on promotion of process participatory livelihood development planning in consider of person with disabilities. Community mobilization, local resources mobilization, capacity building to provide self-employment opportunities for sustainable livelihood of person with disabilities and enjoys accessibility to use of government services.

This project intervention will ensure improved conditions for cooperation between local government, local administration, government service providers, local actors and disadvantaged person with disabilities and physically challenged people (women and men) to collectively address livelihoods and vulnerabilities in Raipur and Sahaspur blocks of Dehradun District, Uttarakhand. Through promoting rights, accessibilities and improving services mechanism the project intervention will benefit around 2000 disadvantaged people including persons with disabilities in the targeted area and will directly create sustainable livelihood opportunities, will create a path to access to use government service.



The project core aspect is to create sustainable livelihood opportunities for disabled persons and vulnerable community people. The activity would cover on providing skill training of people with disabilities as trainers for farm-based activity. People with disabilities from the community equipped with skills in farm-based activities that will support and develop the business plan. This intervention will enable them to create sustainable livelihood opportunities through farming trades. To create sustainability and continuous support for the persons with disabilities, the project would enable environment with government and networking various other link minded organization for the welfare and services. Most importantly, the network will be facilitated for financial inclusion through banks for sustainable supports to enhance their livelihood opportunities and scope.

The major components of the project include creating livelihood in vulnerable community on principles of inclusion and participation. The project will intervene on trainings, Transferring skills, assets and awareness to communities, especially among persons with disabilities. We shall form and strengthen Farmer Producer Organization in the livelihood opportunity with established business plan. Fostering persons with disabilities in leadership and decision making roles.



### Project Success:

Being in the initial stage, we have been able to map the villages and identify the beneficiaries. We have conducted the baseline and propose to take undertake a strong recommendation from the survey for the betterment and welfare of the beneficiaries. The sample size of the baseline was 306 beneficiaries who participated in the survey. Sanjeevani strongly believes to make this project successful for the people with the committed services.



### Project Name:

Animal Welfare - Promotion of sustainable cultivation of Azolla as alternative fodder for the welfare of equines and to support for the equine owners with the provision of rations as Covid-19 relief works.

### Project Location

Almora District, Uttarakhand

### Project Partner

The Donkey Sanctuary's – TDS (United Kingdom)

The Donkey Sanctuary's organization collaborated with Sanjeevani for undertaking a project for Covid-19 emergency fund (CERF) in support mule care and their families through promoting azolla cultivation as alternative fodder for mules and also supports the families with the supply for rations. In these perspectives, the project was initiated in the month of 15th December 2020 and the project ended on 30th March 2021. Based on the project objectives and goals, the project implementation was initiated in the field. Sanjeevani has carried out the project activities such as conducting baseline survey of equine welfare and 500 equine owners, group formation of owners for activities such a azolla cultivation and network meeting with the local veterinary hospitals, trainings on azolla cultivation and a network meeting with local veterinary hospital were also conducted.

### Project Narration and interventions

Sanjeevani has developed this project with the perspective, not just providing treatments and supply of provisions during this Covid19 for mules and their owners, but moving to a more sustainable approach of building partnerships with civil society and various government bodies to bring about long-term change for mules and better livelihood for owners.

The project aimed to support equines, their owners and families through promoting azolla cultivation as alternate fodder for equines and support the families with supply of rations. The aftermath of COVID -19 pandemic, livelihood opportunities has been diminished and their income level also became nothing. This had further resulted in food scarcity among the community members. The savings were consumed in the initial months of lockdown. The families lived in extreme poverty and food scarcity. In addition to this, the equines were not given nutritious meals, as the owner had no money to purchase grains. This forced the owners of equines to leave the equines for open grazing but the owner had to consider lockdown restrictions in moving out from his premises. Since, there is no proper fodder for mules, their health and stamina also decreased as only grazing in and around of their homes.

Considering the tough geographical topography and hilly terrain of the intervention area, the medical facilities were not accessible for mules and also the veterinary hospitals very far, and they do not make effort to travel, leave the equine with tradition treatment. Owners are also not aware regarding the facilities provided from the veterinary hospitals due to which equines were not given basic medicines that are extremely required for their better health. The living conditions of equines were miserable where mostly left nearby farm small shed, or left openly. The owners are also not aware regarding the amount of work that his animal should do in such hilly terrain without considering the health/stamina condition of the mules.

### Project Interventions:

To achieve this objective of the project activity, Sanjeevani has focused on the following initiative process and achieved the set targets of the project.



Activity 1: Conducting Baseline Survey

Sanjeevani facilitated the process of conducting the baseline covering 500 families. Although the target of the project for mule cares through Azolla Cultivation promotion is 100, but we initiated ourselves to target the survey 500 respondents of the mule owners in the state of Uttarakhand and particularly covering five development blocks of Almora district. The respondents are living in the scattered areas and also very far hilly regions. From Ranikhet town, they are living in the distance of 110 to 130 kms far on the top of the mountains and hills.

Baseline Survey has been completed in 9 blocks in which 255 villages and 505 equine owners have been surveyed. According to the survey, the owners have 971 mules and 303 horses.

- We prepared the Baseline format
- Conducted Baseline in the field in 9 blocks covering 255 villages.
- We have compiled the baseline data in excel.
- Currently, we prepared the baseline detailed report with the action plan of intervention.



#### Activity 4: Distribution of Ration to Mule owners and poor families



As part of project collaboration in support of Covid 19 emergency support, we have distributed ration to the mule owners and their families in project regions. We identified 500 families (mule owners and marginalized communities) who faced difficult times to get their rations during these pandemic times. Every month, we identified the new mule owners as part of field visits who are living in poor condition and far from the towns to get their basic necessities. We created the database of all the 500 families who received ration support during this Covid pandemic. We collected all the rations packets and travelled to the remote villages and distributed the rations. First, we identified them during our field visit and found the needy people and particularly mule owners and their families' status. Later on, we worked on the distribution of rations. Here are few photos of the mule owners who received the rations from TDS support.

#### Project Results/Outcome/Impact:

The project intervention has reduced the vulnerabilities among mule owners in terms of their own poverty and also mule health issues. The social construct of the region is such that the mule owner community has always been neglected and they are mostly living far away from the main town. Our intervention has collected all the mule owners and brought them under one community. This has enabled to learn the issues related mules and also related to their livelihood expansion. They were not able to get the basic government schemes as they live far away. Our intervention has built a great network with the local government and links the required government schemes to this community. They expressed, they received their first time help through our intervention and also made them aware of alternative solutions for government schemes and fodder production for mules. Also they learned about the livelihood scope to enhance their lives. Our intervention of providing ration at the time of extreme crisis has not only built the relationship of trust between the community and the organization, also it has brought a great relief during their difficult time where they did not have any income.

Azolla fodder will result in healthy equines which will further result in better income of the owner. Cultivation of Azolla as an alternate fodder is another source of earning as the owners can sell the nutritious fodder to other animal owners in the region. Hence, the intervention is not only reducing vulnerability but also building resilience for both the owners and the equines.

The network meetings have resulted in sharing information on various diseases, treatment, medicines and care to be provided to the equines. The owners have become sensitive towards the health of their equines and have enrolled the equines under Insurance cover. The owners have been equipped with the correct information and well aware about the services being provided from the government veterinary hospitals.



### Feedback by Beneficiary:

Virendra Singh, 32 years of age. His native village is at Saraikhet. He is an equine owner. He has four mules namely Chandani, Kallu, Chutaki and Lali. He has been keeping his mules since 2016. He supports his four members of his family through earnings done as livelihood with mules only. First time, with the help of TDS-CERF program he is getting some support for welfare of equines and his family with dignity. He has benefited through our intervention about the insurance of mules. Now he has become an active member of group and he is being recognized in the community. He has participated in our activities like training for azolla, network meetings and also received ration support.

He says that we are happy get services through this project. Azolla has given great relief to buy fodder regularly. Also he has learned about attitude and behavior for the caring for the welfare of equines. He requests for the support of livelihood that will help him to take care of his family.

Today, more than 3 billion people worldwide still use solid fuel e.g., wood or charcoal for cooking. Often in open fire places which have an extremely inefficient combustion and produce a lot of smoke, this results in significant health, time and work burden for women who are typically in charge of the fire wood collection and cooking. Further, the inefficient use of solid fuels may also put an extra drain on forests and climate. One way to improve these issues and reduce the burdens on women is recourse to energy efficient improved cooking stoves. The purpose of the stove project was to reduce firewood consumption and hence ease the burden of firewood collection for women and young girls. In addition, the stove produces less smoke which can help to improve women's health.

Many Cookstove programs have been implemented for improving the climate condition. The objectives of these programs have been to reduce fuel use and hence reduce deforestation, and improve the health conditions of end users by reducing environmental emissions. Other objectives include improving the social life of people in developing countries and reducing global climate change.

SanjeevaniEvam Jan KalyanSamiti, along with Integra Micro Systems is a Bangalore based IT company, and founding member of the Fair Climate Network. Together, we are deeply concerned with maintaining Climate integrity, and one among a growing number of Indian companies who have pledged to go carbon neutral in spite of there being no national or international compliance requirement in force. Our two-pronged strategy is:

- Identify operational areas where we can reduce our own GHG emissions, and
- Offset what we are unable to reduce by supporting rural women to enrich their lives in a sustainable manner, while making a positive impact on the environment.

The project has been initiated since 2017 in the region of Almora district in the state of Uttarakhand.



### Project Interventions:

Sanjeevani focus on improving the quality of lives of women and protect their natural resources in the Himalayas. In this objective, Sanjeevani joined Fair Climate Network. After several meetings, skill and conceptual training sessions, given by the Integra Micro system and Fair climate network, we undertook this project in 70 villages. Sanjeevani, along with other partners together registered a Gold Standard Project for the rural communities in Uttarakhand".

One of the components of this Climate Project was to supply 2 fuel efficient woodstoves each to 1850 women in Almora district. We held village meetings and made every single End User woman understand that this was a business transaction. By using her Woodstoves, she would cut her fuel wood usage by half and generate Carbon Offsets, with which she will repay the Carbon Investor. During this year, we added 300 new end users and provide the woodstoves. Greenway Smart Stoves has distributed to 1850 households by Sanjeevani to reduce environmental carbon emissions. Greenway Smart Stove is characterized by the consumption of 70 percent less wood and 70 percent less smoke, thereby reducing the health issues of women, reducing labor work firewood searching, and moreover saving time in cooking. Greenway Smart Stove is a single-burner, high efficiency cookstove that works on all solid biomass fuels such as wood, dry dung, crop waste, coconut waste, bamboo etc. The stove does not require any fuel processing/cutting. The reduction in carbon emissions to the environment by burning Greenway Smart Stoves would have generated a carbon footprint. The proceeds generated from selling the carbon footprint are then distributed among Greenway smart stove users.

The first phase of Sanjeevani Wood Stove started from June 2017 in which the baseline survey was conducted in the development blocks Bhikyasain, Salt and Syalde. Two development blocks were selected for the first phase, out of which a total of 1550 families were registered in 121 development block Salt and 1429 families in Bhikyasain. Greenway Smart Stoves were distributed in two clusters Greenway Smart Stoves were given to 503 families in the first year, next year 1429 Greenway Smart Stoves were distributed in the second cluster. The Sanjeevani Wood Stove program was successfully completed in May 2021, out of which 503 users completed 4 years and 1047 users completed 3 years. The carbon footprint generated by Greenway Smart Stove users over the past 4 years by reducing the carbon footprint they generate was sold and the proceeds were distributed to the users. Rs. 4066 for 4 years users and Rs 2712 for 3 years users.





The second phase of Sanjeevani Wood Stove started in June 2021. In which the registration process was done again in the development blocks Salt and Bhikyasain. The registration work of 1550 families was done in 56 villages, out of which 300 new families were registered in 9 new villages. This time greenway smart stoves were distributed to 1333 users in 50 villages of development block Bhikyasain and 217 users in 6 villages of development block Salt.

Currently Greenway Smart Stove is being used more and more in the project area, as user says Greenway Smart Stove saves wood, smoke less, takes less time to cook, thereby saving time. Under the Sanjeevani Wood Stove Programme, 12,634 tonnes of carbon have been credited by the use of Greenway Smart Stoves in 4 years from June 2017 to May 2021.

The programme gives rise to new employment opportunities for stove technicians, distributors/ dealers, people engaged in awareness campaigns, and other support stakeholders. The programme leads to improvements in living conditions especially for women in project households. The Greenway woodstoves are fuel efficient compared to traditional chulhas. Therefore, the programme reduces the drudgery of fuel wood collection for women and young children by reducing the time required for this activity. Furthermore, reduction in biomass consumption directly reduces cooking costs for the project population permitting higher savings for end users. The project contributes towards improving access to affordable and clean energy services.



The programme aims to develop human and institutional capacity of project households in the project region. The programme conducted awareness campaigns to sensitize people against the ill-effects. Further, by reducing the amount of cooking time (better heat transfer in Smart woodstoves saves cooking time) the programme provides women in project households with more time to invest in productive and capacity development activities.

### 1. MaaAgneri FPO, Chaukhutia block, (Almora District, Uttarakhand):

MaaAgneri Farmer Producer Co. Ltd. Chaukhutia was registered in the year 2020 in collaboration with NABARD. Sanjeevani created awareness programs for the farmers in the selected villages. This has enabled the farmers to form the groups and start the company to enhance their livelihood and agriculture products and engage in direct marketing by farmers along with the local traders. The Farmer producer organization was formed in the region of Chaukhutia, Almora District, and Uttarakhand. The FPO is currently very active and continues to play vital role through shares and creating marginal profit every year. The FPO is engaged in vegetable production and marketing of it directly.

The Company's Account is opened in Bank of Baroda's Chaukhutia branch for working Capital Account and Share Capital Account opened. The Board of Members of the FPO and the farmers decided that the price per share for being a shareholder in the company has been fixed at Rs. 1000. The FPO has conducted official meetings of members and share holders every quarter. 163 farmers have subscribed to this particular FPO and became shareholders. All 163 farmers have bought shares in Ma AgneriKrishakUtpadak Company Limited. The total amount of which Rs 1,63,000/- has been deposited in the share capital account. For which frequent meetings were organized with the farmers. Sanjeevani has been continuously organizing workshops and trainings for the farmers for the high yield production and marketing. We have engaged business consultant for the business plan of the FPO with long term strategy. In the financial year 2021-2022, the business of Rs.2,48,484/- has been done by Ma AgneriKrishakUtpadak Co. Ltd., in which the company has got a profit of Rs.17,222/-. The list provides the results of FPO for the year 2021-22.

## 2. Chaukot Patti FPO, Sylde block, (Almora District, Uttarakhand):

Chaukot Patti KrishakUtpadak Company Limited was registered in collaboration with NABARD in the year 2020. Sanjeevani started the mobilization of the farmers and formed the FPO with the purpose of increased production, livelihood and marketing directly by the farmers. The registered FPO opened the accounts of working Capital and share capital in UttarakhandGramin Bank branch Deghat. Currently, 143 farmers became the members of the FPOs and 1000 per share price has been fixed by the board of members of the FPO and the farmers for the stake in the company. The FPO is engaged in vegetable production and marketing of them directly.

The FPO conducts regular formal meetings of the Board members and discusses the marketing and business plan. FPO also creates awareness workshops and trainings for the Farmers groups and its members on production and marketing scopes. Also it provides the technical information and linkage the farmer's schemes and services for the eligible farmers.

In the financial year 2021-2022, 143 farmers became the members of FPO. All the 143 farmers bought shares in Chaukot Patti Krishak Producer Company Limited, whose total amount was deposited in the share capital account of Rs.1,43,000. During the last financial year, the FPO made the business of Rs.2,12,306/- and the company has got a profit of Rs.16,866/-. The list provides the results of FPO for the year 2021-22.

### 3. Himachal Farmer Producer Cooperative Society Ltd, Seraj Block (Manidi District, Himachal Pradesh) – Supported by HDFC Bank CSR Parivartan

The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd., Seraj got registered on 31st January 2022 under Himachal Pradesh Cooperative Society Act, 1968. The cooperative was established under the Focussed Development Programme supported by HDFC Bank CSR, Parivartan and implemented by SanjeevaniVikasEvam Jan KalyanSamiti

As the Himachal Pradesh was new area for Sanjeevani, the team started with mobilization and trust building with the community. Later, the team organized orientation meetings and created Farmers Interest Group (FIGs). The formed FIGs are first community institution initiated for growers in the area. The formed FIGs provide base of the cooperative as the members of established community institution created the opportunity to establish a business venture for social cause.



The cooperative is for the growers, by the growers and from the growers as the functional board members of the cooperative was elected by the growers itself through a transparent process. The Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd. is performing their tasks with the technical support of Sanjeevani and per share cost 500 rupees and 125 rupees is membership fee. Whereas, to become a shareholder, a grower needs to buy 6 shares of the cooperative. At present, the cooperative has 11 board members and they are doing business in fresh apples and bi products in established processing unit, supported by the programme i.e., apple juice- RTS (Ready to serve) and concentrated, apple jam and apple cider vinegar.

The cooperative organizes their monthly meetings on 5th of every month where they discuss about the finances and business done by the cooperative and future prospects. They also have their committee meetings on the same day as per the requirement.

In 2021-22, The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd. has sold 115 tons of fresh apples through direct market linkage and from procured 'C' grade apples produced 1800 litres of apple cider vinegar, 1450 litres of concentrated juice and more than 2000 kilograms of pulp to prepare jam. The total business done by the cooperative in 2021- 22 was worth of 3,00,751 rupees. In the new financial year, The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd. has planned to explore to new market opportunities and expand their business.

**Project Summary:** The Uttarakhand Oak Tasar Development Project is a project run by the Central Silk Board (Ministry of Textiles, Government of India). In Uttarakhand this project is being implemented by Directorate of Silk, Premnagar, Dehradun, in which Sanjeevani Vikas and Jan Kalyan Samiti is working in the project area (Block Kapkot of District Bageshwar).

OakTusar is an agro based rural cottage industry. Oak Tasar is a wild silk produced by the silkworm *Antheria procili* on various species of oak plant in the sub-Himalayan region of India from northwest to northeast. Oak Tasar sericulture provides means of earning 5-20 thousand rupees per family in 45-50 days with very low cost. The oak plant forest wealth spread over an area of about 3.50 lakh hectares in Uttarakhand is a major source of livelihood for the residents of the area by rearing Oak Tasar silkworm. Oak Tasar silk industry involves various pre-koss techniques like planting and maintenance of oak plants, silkworm seed production, silkworm rearing and post-harvest techniques like threading and weaving of cloth etc. The main objective is that the oak plant forest wealth spread in Uttarakhand is a major source of livelihood for the residents of the area by rearing Oak Tasar silkworm. The main objective of this project is to increase livelihood and income earning activities and to bring sericulture into the mainstream.

## Project – 08



Sanjeevani have various interventions under Oak Tasar Project which are narrated as described below;

#### A. Beneficiary Selection Process

First the process of beneficiary selection was conducted by the institution for the project. For beneficiary selection, the beneficiaries have been selected according to the standards set by the central government. Sanjeevani Project is running the program through 325 beneficiaries of fourteen gram panchayats of Kapkot block.

#### B. Creation of insect rearing planets and grain

So far the construction work of 43 insect foster planets has been completed by Sanjeevani. The rearing work is being done by the beneficiaries in the insect rearing planets. In the year 2020-21, in the month of April-May, the rearing work was done by the institution after taking administrative permission during Kovid. This work was done by total 7 beneficiaries of 4 gram panchayats in which total 47000 cocoons were produced. Due to which a total amount of 75000 rupees was earned by the farmers. In the year 2021-2022, a total of 50000 cocoons were produced by the institution in the rearing done in the month of March-April, out of which 9000 cocoons were produced in the silk farm Linthura Pithoragarh and the rest were produced in the project area, thereby generating total income. Received Rs 50000.



#### C. Nursery establishment

A total of 4 nurseries have been engaged by Sanjeevani so far. This nursery has been planted in 2 acres, in which about 80000 saplings of Manipuri falcon have been planted. The main objective of nursery is related to plantation during rainy season and winter season.



#### D. Afforestation

One of the main objectives of the Oak Tasar project is to plant the Manipuri falcon plants. Under this, plantation of 170000 Manipuri falcon plants has been done so far by Sanjeevani Sanstha in 14 villages of the project area, due to which Manipuri falcon has been planted in an area of 100 hectares.



#### E. Training Program- Training programs like nursery, afforestation, insect rearing, plantation.

etc. were conducted by Sanjeevani Sanstha in 14 villages of the project area, in which 300 beneficiaries participated. For providing training, technical assistants from the silk department and scientist Dr. S. R. S., Bhimtal were invited to the project area. .

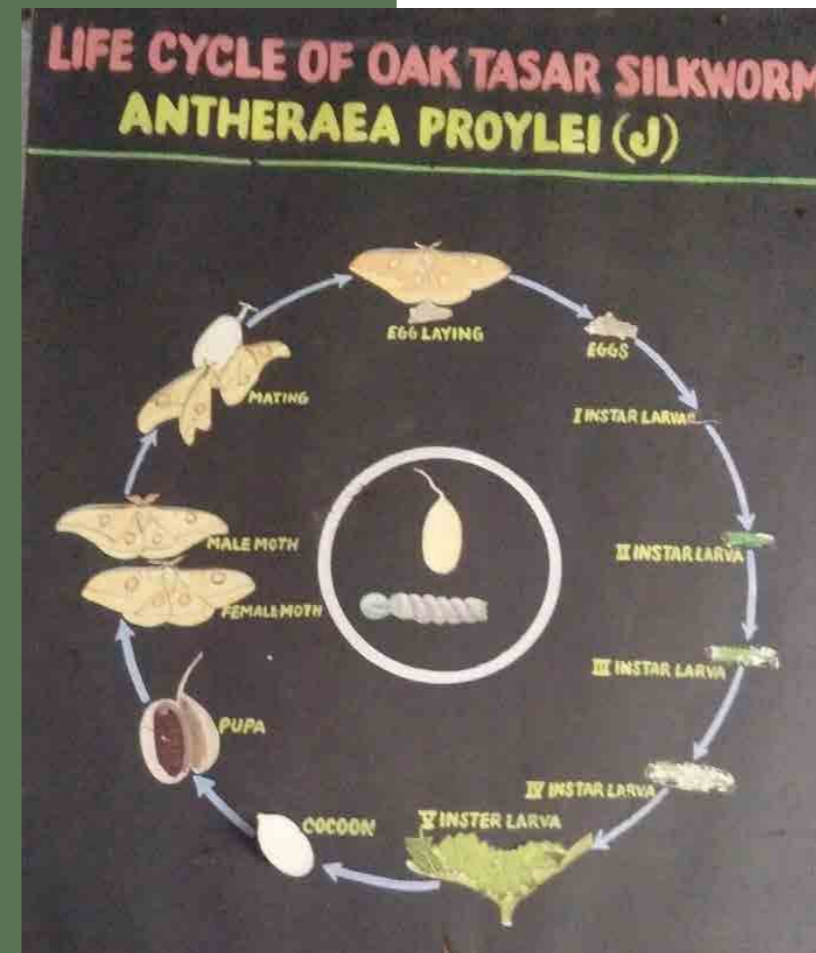


### F. Farmer Tour Program

Beneficiaries were made to participate in Reshma Krishi Mela, Bhimtal by Sanjeevani Sanstha. In this program the participants got an opportunity to learn the subtleties of silk.

### G. R.D.P. Program

This program is a day program organized under the aegis of the Central Silk Board, in which Sanjeevani Sanstha has got the first position.

Shiv Nadar Foundation, Noida has two VidyaGyan schools in Uttar Pradesh, one in Bulandshahr and the other in Sitapur. The purpose of the schools is to support talented poor rural children who have selected in the Northern States and provide free education in established residential schools. The students will not pay any education fees and accommodation fees. To identify and select the student, Shiv Nadar Foundation has standard criteria and process. They have partnered with the prominent NGOs in the northern states. Sanjeevani is one of the prominent NGOs who implement the educational program in the state of Uttarakhand in Kumbavaon regions. The NGO conducts the entrance examinations in the local identified schools and the final students are selected with proper standard process in coordination with Shiv Nadar Foundation.

## Project Interventions

Initiated by Shiv Nadar Foundation, VidyaGyan Leadership Academy, Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh wanted to level the educational playfield by providing opportunities to children from economically backward families from all the 75 districts of UP. Opportunities that help them learn from the best, play with abandon, discover latent talents and aspire for prestigious higher education opportunities. Their journey would start from class VI and VidyaGyan would nurture them till class XII. A residential academy, VidyaGyan aims at providing the opportunities of a world-class leadership academy to the economically backward students of rural India. This academy aims to drive transformation in the country by investing in the youth and catalyzing them into future leaders

Sanjeevani has partnered with Shiv Nadar Foundation to facilitate the process of identification and selection of the poor students for VidyaGyan program in the regions of Uttarakhand. The selected students will be for 6th standard and 7th standard. To carry out the selection process, Sanjeevani field team started visiting the schools and planned for the first entrance examinations. The team selected the entire Almora district and started collecting the school data and visited and informed about the VidyaGyan program. The team conducted workshops for the teachers and students about the VidyaGyan program in the selected 23 schools. We received the approval and consent from the schools authorities and they appreciated the initiatives



We started the registration of the students for the entrance examinations with the support of school teachers. There were 633 students who registered under VidyaGyan program. The students were from different blocks 162 in Chaukhutia, 164 in Almora, 135 in Ranikhet and 172 in Bhikyasain. We established in examination centers in each locations. In the first level of Entrance examination, 101 students were selected for the second round examination under direct guidance from VidyaGyan School in Bulandshahr, Uttarpradesh. Out of 101 students, 73 in class 6 and 28 students for class 7. In the final selection process and criteria, 6 students (4 Girls, 2 Boys) got selected under VidyaGyan program where the students will get free education under resident schools of VidyaGyan program. The final selected students family visits are done by Vidyagyan project team. The selected students will join the academy for the academic year 2022-23. These students will pursue their education in the residential school till class XII.

As an adult every human being rich or poor whatever be their religion, has a great responsibility of giving the utmost care and protection to every child. Children too have all the right to live with due respect a loving and abuse free life. But in practice how much of this statement is true. Every second somewhere in this world there is a child either abused, trafficked, raped, put to hard labour and so on, robbing the very essence of childhood from these children and who are the culprits...? Shamefully, but very truly they are "ADULTS". It is in protecting these very rights of children that Sanjeevani stretched out its hands to embrace Child Help Line since in 2016 as a Collab agency in Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. It was felt that Child helpline in reaching out to society will help it to realize the work CHILDLINE does at the same time and more importantly, understand the actual facts of children at risk.

## Project Interventions

**CHILDLINE** reaches out to the most marginalized children with the aim of providing them rehabilitation and care from unsafe situations. **CHILDLINE** provides relief and rehabilitation in the space of shelter, medical aid, repatriation, rescue, emotional support and guidance etc.

Child Help Line 1098 is India's first 24-hour toll free, emergency phone outreach service to connect children in need of care and protection with long-term services for their care and rehabilitation. Any child and adult concerned can call 1098 and use the child line service at any time of the day or night. The vision of Child Help Line is to build a child-friendly nation that guarantees the rights and safety of all children. Child Help Line 1098 is a special family, every call in it is important. Childline does not work alone and is transparent and accountable.

# CHILD PROTECTION



## Main Objectives of Child Line:

1. Reaching every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies and physically reaching the children.
2. Working together with supporting systems (police, health care, justice, transportation, legal, education, communication, media, political and community) to create child friendly systems.
3. Providing services for inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate children.
4. Liaising with bodies, government and non-government organizations working under national policies for children.

## Child Protection Activities by Child Line

1. Rescue and emergency outreach services are provided for children in care and protection.
2. Children are saved with the help of local departments like police, administration, labor etc.
3. Proper documentation of all the rescued children is ensured and their rehabilitation and restoration facilities are provided.
4. Keeping in view the care and safety of the children, the children are presented before the Child Welfare Committee.
5. Childline supports Child Welfare Committee in long term rehabilitation of children when it is found to be an urgent need.
6. Relative cooperation is obtained from the children working at the state or national level to trace the missing children.
7. Organizing programs like outreach, open house, phone testing etc. for awareness so that child helpline number 1098 can be reached.
8. To reach the information of child protection schemes operated at the departmental level to the society so that the children can be benefited.
9. To establish linkages with other child protection services, community and local bodies to meet the immediate needs of the rescued children



### A. Open house program

The main objective of the open house program is to spread awareness, an open house program is organized every month by Child Line, in which it is easy for the children to tell their problems. Open house can be organized at places like schools, bus stations, parks, railway stations etc.

So far 78 open house programs have been done by Sanjeevani Child Line, due to which the service of Child Line has been reached to 19500 children. Food items are also provided to the children during the open house programs.

### B. Childline se friendship week

Every year from November 14 to November 21, Child-line Se Dosti Week program is celebrated by Childline, whose main objective is to strengthen the feeling of trust between children and Childline.

Under this week, different programs are organized in each day such as security bandhan program, signature campaign program, oath program, rally program, cultural program, debate, painting, children's fair etc.

With new vision, Leo & Mia Foundation, Early Interventions, United Kingdom, has partnered with Sanjeevani Vikas Evam Jan Kalyan Samiti and initiated a project on preterm/ maternal and child health interventions. Aiming to improve the health care facilities of Preterm /Maternal and child and for their well-being. Currently, the project is operational in 2 hilly states i.e., in Bhikyasen block of Almora District, Uttarakhand and Seraj block of Mandi District, Himachal Pradesh with 400 women in each district from reproductive age 18- 45 years old including adolescents, lactating and pregnant women out of which 200 are pregnant only. The Preterm/ Maternal and Child Interventions is in primary phase only, where the prime target group is pregnant women. The notion of the programme is to ensure antenatal care for healthier delivery and outcome. The project is based on the assumption that health works in a vicious cycle which starts in the womb. By providing good care to pregnant woman, we can also make sure the health of the infant and prepare a strong future generation.

**Theory of change and Interventions:**

Sanjeevani proposes the intervention which will serve the directly for the benefit of women in their reproductive age of (18 – 45 years) and improve RMNCH. The primary beneficiary of the programme will be a moving cohort of women in their reproductive age. The proposed programme aims to reduce;



Maternal and Child Health program Health been designed and developed as an innovative and integrated approach for improving RMNCH+A Health Outcomes. The initiative has been built upon both Community & Facility Level Interventions with focus on improving both demand and delivery of services & for ensuring Respectful & Quality Care across all levels. We Successful implementation of the initiative would lead to decrease in Maternal & newborn Mortality in the State of Himachal Pradesh in Seraj block, Mandi District.

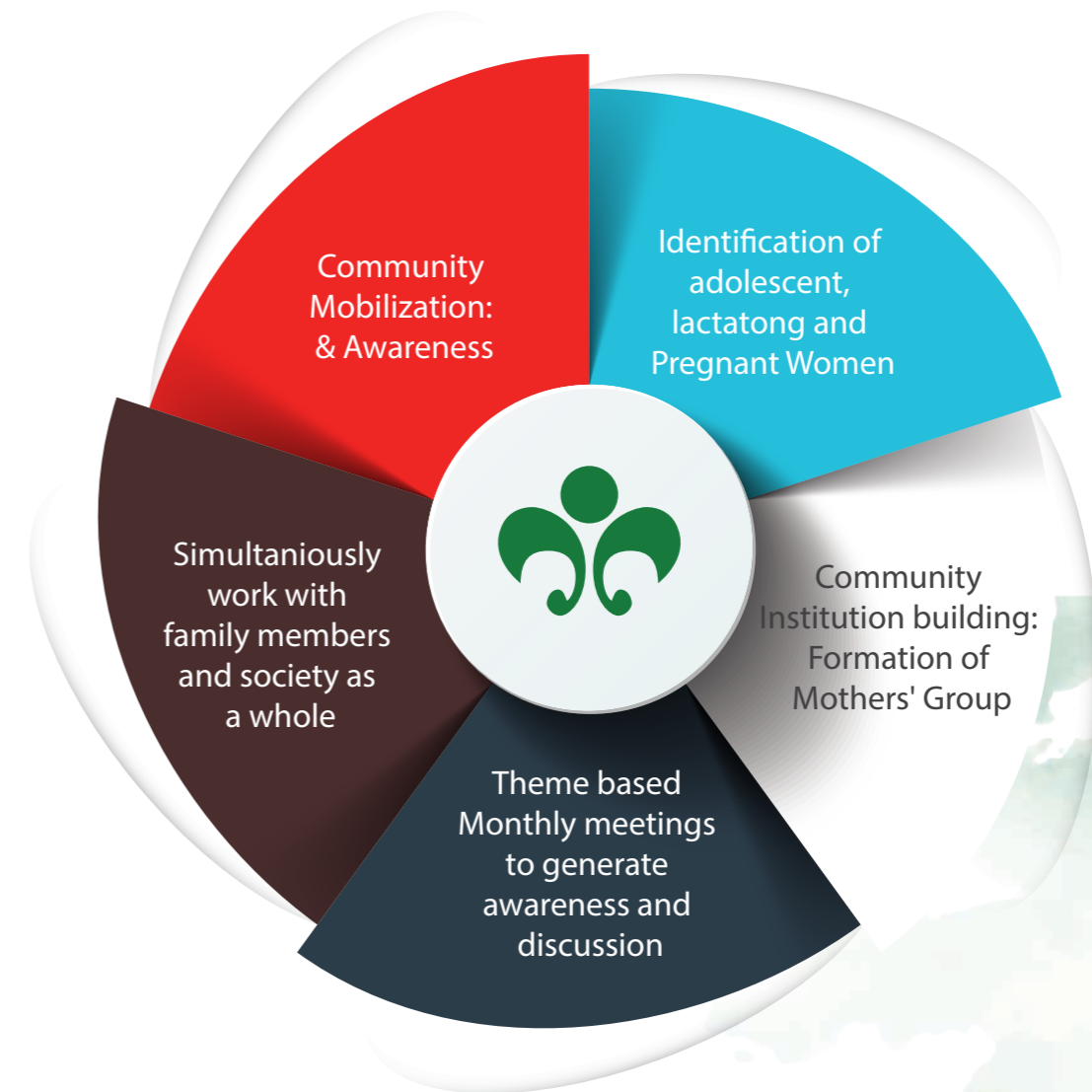
The programme consists of essential component that relevant to rural hilly regions; the project has been initiated in the month of Marcy 2022. We conducted the baseline survey to identify the pregnant women in the selected districts. The project interventions will be rolled out in the following years.

### 1. Improve Health Care Service Delivery:

Under this direct intervention, we shall provide quality care for women and adolescent girls before, between, and during pregnancies; we shall strengthen the facilities with modern equipment and supplies for preterm babies and mother care facilities in the selected two sub health centers; and finally, we shall network with local health centers and strengthen referral systems and also advocate for the linkage of government schemes and services to preterm babies and mother.

### 2. Increasing uptake of health services through empowerment of Project staff, women, girls, men, boys, and community leaders<sup>2</sup>. Increasing uptake of health services through empowerment of Project staff, women, girls, men, boys, and community leaders:

As part of community services and intervention, we shall work with community and families, traditional birth attendants, youth groups, and local media to raise awareness of gender equality issues, family planning methods, healthy lifestyles, and taboos related to preterm birth; It will consist of interpersonal communication, print media, mid media, and digital media. Continued exposure to messages from various channels will help in recall, breaking barriers, increasing knowledge and information, building capacities/approval and initiating practice, thus facilitating change. Secondly, we shall target to capacity building of the staff and health workers at the local level and provides the technical knowledge. For improved antenatal care, the programme proposes to work with frontline health worker capacity building (ASHA Workers) and other local health professionals.



### 3. Direct Delivery care packages for Mother & Child:

As part of direct services to provide care package for the mother and child, we propose to cover the following intervention of activities; Formation of women groups; Listing and mapping of beneficiaries and their family members, Health profiles of Identified mothers; Nutrition and protein package for the mother during pregnancy; Medical and Clinical Support to Pre-term Babies for poor families and mother, Care Bag during the delivery for child and mother (Blanket for mother, New born baby kits etc) providing basic essential kits for the preterm babies born; To coordinate with local government for the mother and child schemes and service; We shall have continuous meetings with Mothers group and follow up visits of the pregnant and delivered mother and child.

## Project Expected results and outcome:

The major primary outcomes of Preterm/ Maternal and Child Health Intervention-programme are:

1. Increase the facilities related preterm births and save both mother and child.
2. Reduction in maternal deaths.
3. Reduction in neo-natal deaths.
4. Increase in accessibility of strengthening referral systems and also government schemes and services.
5. Awareness about causes of pre-term babies, malnutrition, mother and child care.



## Programme outputs include

1. Increased awareness on reproductive, maternal, new-born, and child health.
2. Timely, adequate, and appropriate ante-natal care delivered to all pregnant beneficiaries.
3. Nutrition supplement delivered routinely to all compliant beneficiaries.
4. Mechanisms for accurate identification of vulnerable neonates established.
5. Evidence and resource produced for replication in similar settings.
6. Improved quality health service systems at least two centers in the block level.

High yield varieties plantation drive for enhancing income of small and marginal growers for sustainable livelihood and carbon footprints mitigation

In partnership with HDFC Bank CSR Parivartan, SanjeevaniVikasEvam Jan KalyanSamiti implemented the project “High yield varieties plantation drive for enhancing income of small and marginal growers for sustainable livelihood and carbon footprints mitigation”. With the aim to enhance income of small and marginal growers for sustainable livelihood and carbon footprints mitigation the project was implemented in 178 villages of 16 Gram Panchayats. It was a 5-month project with 9185 apple growers.

### Project Interventions:

The notion of the project was to enhance the knowledge and skill of the selected farmers. By supporting access to knowledge, technology, and information the project contributed to increase productivity along with quality of produce. The project has also supported interventions designed to help the farmers in the horticulture sector aiming to enhance their income. Through plantation we subsequently worked towards carbon mitigation for sustainable development of the area. In order to attain set goal and objective the instigated activities were.



a. Orientation and Training of Village Coordinators:

As the project team was new to reduction of carbon footprint and climate change, their orientation towards the issues were important. The quality implementation of a project highly depends on the understanding of the team. Therefore, orientation and training programmes were organized for the team.

b. Data Collection:

In the beginning of the project, the team collected the secondary data through village and gram panchayat representatives. But, for ground implementation the team required an authentic data on the basis of which they could plan the activities. Thus, a survey was conducted with 7020 households where the team collected their basic information along with land holding and current practices for apple cultivation. This data helped to bridge the gap between primary data and secondary data of number of households per gram panchayat.



c. Awareness, Mobilization and Workshops:

In order to reduce carbon footprint and sensitize the community awareness, mobilization and workshop programmes were organized. The objective of the conducted programmes was to spread the awareness among the community about the organizations along with creating the sensitization regarding climate change pest management, integrated soil fertility management, pre- and post-harvest management, training and pruning. The aim was to enhance the income by raising awareness about effective cultivation practices and varieties.

d. Pit Digging and Land Preparation:

Occurrence of climate change is adversely affected the farming. Additionally, the growers are still stick to old practices and ignoring the demand to adopt the scientific way of farming. Through the organized workshops awareness was created regarding the same. The growers were motivated for pit digging and soil preparation for plants. Overall, 85,006 pits were prepared for apple plantation. The discussions were held on pit depth and width, row spacing, layout of the field, soil health management, soil PH value and organic manuring. This helped in reducing overall input cost borne by the farmers and maximum utilization of land consequently, enhancing their income.



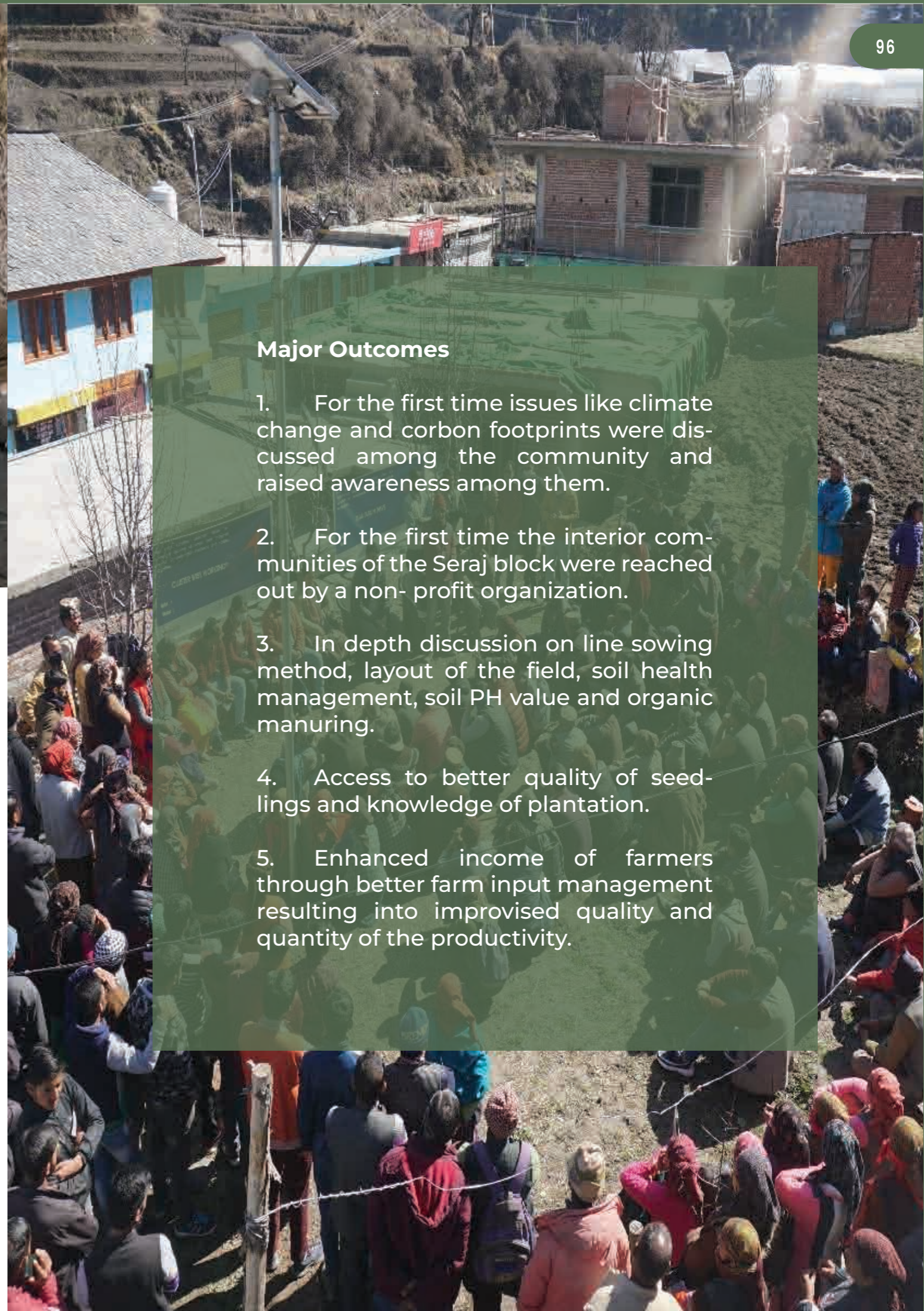
#### e. New Apple Orchard Development

The primary sector is developing and scientifically advanced techniques are being introduced. Multiple new high yield varieties have been introduced to make agriculture and horticulture more profitable. With the aim to reduce input cost while enhancing the quality and quantity of the productivity 85006 apple plants were distributed. 9 varieties of apples i.e., gala, king roat and jaromine, redlum gala, red-velox and others were procured and distributed depending upon the climatic conditions of the area. They also received a variety of plant which has a pollinizer in it which will improve the quality of the growers' orchard.

Through the project the seedlings of quality got available for marginal farmers. It was done to support the growers' income. The growers receive the information about spacing in between the plants and rows depending upon the geographical conditions upon the farm. The team also discussed about the importance of pollination and let the growers knew about the gala which is a variety of pollinizer.

#### f. Celebration of International Women's Day

On 8th March 2022, International women's day was celebrated with 160 women's (widows, women with disability and single women) from three-gram panchayats (DheemKataru, DharJarol and Bung Railchowk). The team invited women from the community to share their views and experiences. Later, the celebration was followed by a Cultural programme. The team honored all the women by giving ten apple plants to each. 1600 plants were distributed amongst these women. The financial support to organize the event was provided by Sanjeevani. This created a platform and united female growers to appreciate their contribution in the farming by acknowledging and celebrating their womanhood.



#### Major Outcomes

1. For the first time issues like climate change and carbon footprints were discussed among the community and raised awareness among them.
2. For the first time the interior communities of the Seraj block were reached out by a non-profit organization.
3. In depth discussion on line sowing method, layout of the field, soil health management, soil PH value and organic manuring.
4. Access to better quality of seedlings and knowledge of plantation.
5. Enhanced income of farmers through better farm input management resulting into improvised quality and quantity of the productivity.
