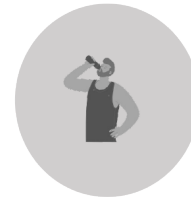

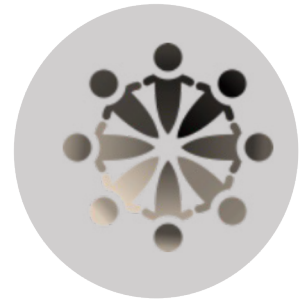

Empowering Change through Sanjeevani Wood Stove Program

In the heart of Almora district, Uttarakhand, Sanjeevani Vikas Evam Jan Kalyan Samiti is working unremittingly towards a sustainable future. As we review our journey, we are humbled by the impact of our Wood Stove Program. By empowering rural women and persons with disabilities, the programme has not only mitigated carbon emissions but also ignited hope and transformed lives.

The Sanjeevani Wood Stove Program has been a beacon of transformation. These stoves have become catalysts for change, reducing wood consumption and smoke production by 70%. Our right holders experience improved eye health, reduction in time, and labor. Most importantly, these stoves have significantly reduced carbon emissions, leaving a smaller footprint on our environment.

Sanjeevani started its first Climate Programme – “Sanjeevani Woodstove” with the initial support from Integra Microsystem, a Bangalore based IT company in 2017 and deployed 4,100 Greenway smart stoves to 3,100 rural Himalayan families of district Almora, Uttarakhand, lighting up their lives with warmth and sustainability. We completed our emission reduction purchase agreement (ERPA) with Integra in 2020, and since Sanjeevani Woodstove program is on self-sustained mode. The carbon revenue generated from the sale of carbon emission reduction was transferred to each end-user women in their bank accounts. Each end-user women received bank transfer of Rs. 3000-5000 as per their actual usage. With this climate program, we reduced an astounding 44,960 tonnes of carbon dioxide and generated carbon credits from June 2017 to October 2023. At present we are renewing this Gold Standard climate program for next 5 years. The impact of the Sanjeevani Wood Stove Program goes beyond environmental sustainability. It has brought about a profound change in the lives of rural communities, particularly women.

By embracing Improved Cook Stoves, the programme has reduced the burden of fuel wood collection, emancipation to pursue their dreams and aspirations. Furthermore, the reduced cooking costs have facilitated economic growth and higher savings, promoting a brighter future for all. Thereby, the programme not only mitigates carbon emissions but also instills a sense of empowerment, dignity, and resilience within communities.

Our partnerships and unwavering dedication have ignited transformative change, leaving a lasting legacy for generations to come. The Sanjeevani Wood Stove Program has illuminated lives, transformed livelihoods, and instilled hope in the hearts of rural communities.





Reducing Carbon Footprints: Inclusive Journey of Change & Sustainability

From the flying colors of Sanjeevani Woodstove program success, Sanjeevani continued its journey in collaboration with CBM India Trust, has embarked on a transformative journey to diminish carbon footprints and empower marginalized segments of society. Through this all-encompassing initiative, our objective is to enhance the adoption of Improved Cook Stoves (ICS), as well as promote improved health practices and agricultural technologies among 2,400 rural women and individuals with disabilities, along with their families, residing in 57 villages within the Tarikhet block of Almora district. This project holds immense potential to effect substantial change in the region.

At Sanjeevani, we are fully committed to inclusivity and prioritize the needs of vulnerable individuals. Within the 2,400 families involved, we have identified 110 males, 182 females, 15 boys, and 16 girls with disabilities, ensuring their active participation and engagement in the project. Our partnership with CBM India Trust has enabled us to mitigate carbon emissions through the utilization of Improved Cook Stoves (ICS), while also generating carbon offsets. By advocating the use of fuel-efficient cookstoves and reducing fuelwood consumption, the 2,400 women involved in the project will significantly contribute to the generation of 30,168 Gold Standard Verified Emissions Reductions (GS VERs) in three years. In order to raise awareness and empower the community, we have organized awareness programs on climate change, as well as health and hygiene initiatives. These endeavours strive to equip rural women, individuals with disabilities, and their family members with fundamental knowledge about climate change, the benefits of ICS usage, and health and hygiene practices. As a result, we have been able to establish 60 Inclusive User Groups (IUGs).

We have successfully organized ICS demonstrations across all project villages, facilitating the distribution of improved cook stoves to all 2,400 families, which also includes 323 persons with disabilities. The distribution process serves as the starting point for our end-users to actively participate in emission reduction efforts. To ensure effective implementation and monitoring, Village Volunteers/Monitors were appointed in each project village, following their election during IUG meetings.

The comprehensive training sessions covered a wide range of topics, including the benefits of

ICS usage, health, Capacity Building for Inclusive Development (CBID),

ICS usage, health, Capacity Building for Inclusive Development (CBID), safeguarding, and data collection. Through these efforts, end-users are saving time, fuelwood, and experiencing a significant reduction (50-60%) in indoor air pollution, thereby preventing respiratory illnesses and eye irritation. The positive response from women towards these ICS serves as a testament to their empowerment.

The introduction of ICS in these communities has resulted in a reduction of firewood usage by approximately 60%. Moreover, by utilizing fallen twigs and branches near their habitats, the 2,400 end-users no longer need to venture into the forest, significantly mitigating various forms of human-animal conflict. This reduction in burden has granted women more time for personal pursuits. Additionally, the project is expected to achieve a 70% reduction in household air pollution, leading to 60% fewer cases of eye irritability and respiratory problems within the families.

Beyond the environmental benefits, the usage of ICS by end-users will yield a noteworthy 30,168-ton reduction in carbon emissions over the next three years. These reductions can be converted into potential revenue of ₹2.8 to 3.0 Crore through the sale of generated Carbon Offsets. This additional revenue has the potential to uplift the lives of the community and contribute significantly to their overall development.

Sanjeevani, in collaboration with CBM India Trust, takes immense pride in launching and spearheading this project. Our joint efforts towards sustainable development, carbon emission reduction, and community empowerment exemplify our unwavering commitment to holistic progress. As we move forward, we aspire to expand the reach of our initiatives and create a lasting positive impact in the lives of vulnerable communities.





Since its inception in 2022, the Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay project has dedicated its efforts to the Sahaspur block, in Dehradun district. The programme's primary goal is to bring about significant positive change for persons with and without disabilities, who have long grappled with social and economic challenges. By focusing on rehabilitation and livelihood activities, this project has paved the way towards self-sufficiency for the residents of 18 villages in the region.



Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay - A Journey towards Self-Reliant Communities

We are thrilled to share with you the remarkable progress made by the Sanjeevani organization through its transformative project, Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay – Self-Reliant Community. This initiative, supported by CBM, has been instrumental in improving the quality of life for individuals with disabilities and marginalized members of our community.

One of the main thrusts of the Atmanirbhar Shamoodhay project is skill development and capacity building. Through the establishment of sustainable income sources, such as Mushroom Cultivation, Apiculture, and Vegetable Cultivation, the project has nurtured self-reliance and fostered a more inclusive and equitable society. In the past year, the project team, together with its dedicated partners and volunteers, have achieved remarkable set of milestones, such as:

Establishment of Demonstration Units:

Two mushroom demo units, each equipped with three poly tunnels, have been established in Bhudpur and Dhoomanagar villages. In addition, 30 low-cost Polyhouses have been set up, along with the distribution of 120 bee-boxes. These units serve as valuable learning and training centers for the community, showcasing sustainable livelihood options.

Empowering Master Trainers:

With great pride, we announce that 100 individuals with and without disabilities have become certified Master Trainers for Mushroom Cultivation, Bee-Keeping, and Vegetable Cultivation. These trainers play a vital role in disseminating knowledge and empowering community members with the skills needed to generate sustainable income.

Inclusive Self-Help Groups:

As part of our commitment to fostering empowerment and unity, 28 inclusive self-help groups have been formed. These groups provide a platform for individuals to come together, share their experiences, and support each other in their journey towards self-reliance. Atmanirbhar Divyangjan Sangathan (OPD):

The project facilitated establishment of Atmanirbhar Divyangjan Sangathan, a collective comprising 50 members. This platform aims to amplify the voices of persons with disabilities, ensuring their inclusion in decision-making processes and advocating for their rights.

Rehabilitation Services and Linkages to Social Welfare Schemes: Over 200 children and individuals with disabilities have received vital rehabilitation services, including assessments, therapy, and assistive devices. Moreover, they have been successfully linked to essential social welfare schemes such as UDID cards, Disability Certificates, and Pension, providing them with much-needed support. Four Disability Prevention camps were conducted, to raise awareness about

Taking a bold step into agriculture, Nargis and her father participated in vegetable cultivation training offered under a polyhouse initiative. Equipped with new skills and a determination to succeed, they began making a difference. As part of the project, Mr. Jan Mohd. was supported for construction of polyhouse, which allowed him to cultivate vegetables and earn an impressive income.

What makes this success story truly inspiring is the unity and resilience displayed by Nargis and her sisters. They actively assisted their father in managing the polyhouse, contributing not only to their family's financial well-being but also fostering a sense of empowerment and self-sufficiency within their community. "Igniting Hope and Unity: A tale of unity - Chauda Village

In the heart of Almora district, amidst the breathtaking landscapes of Kapkot Block, lies Chauda village, home to one of the most marginalized tribal communities. These resilient individuals had long been struggling to break free from the shackles of poverty and limited opportunities. However, their lives took a transformative turn when Sanjeevani with the support of NABARD initiated implementation of Tribal Development programme.

While the project initially targeted 42 tribal right holders in the focus area, it was the collective vision and determination of 35 families that laid the foundation for a truly remarkable transformation. Together, they set aside boundaries and embraced cooperative cumulative farming on a 4-hectare plot of land. This act of unity created a powerful synergy that would shape the future of Chauda village forever. The journey towards cooperative cumulative farming was not without its challenges. The project staff recognized the need to ignite a spark within the hearts of these tribal families, encouraging them to rise above their circumstances. Countless meetings were held, fostering an environment of trust, motivation, and empowerment. Through these interactions, the project staff succeeded in instilling a sense of belief and confidence in the tribal beneficiaries, inspiring them to push their own limitations and explore new possibilities.



Now, as we witness the landscape of the Chauda village, we are greeted by a sight that fills our hearts with joy and awe. Spread across the 4-hectare expanse, a flourishing orchard stands tall, bearing the fruits of the community's hard work and dedication. A total of 630 kiwi plants, 175 nectarine plants, and 175 stone fruit plants now thrive in what has become the largest patch of this type of plantation in the Kapkot Block and possibly even in the entire Bageshwar district.

This tribal development initiative is a testament to the power of unity, determination, and the unwavering belief in the potential of marginalized communities. Through their collective efforts, the tribal families have not just planted trees but have sown the seeds of hope, resilience, and possibility. Their journey serves as an inspiration for other communities, proving that with the right support, opportunities, and a united spirit, anything is achievable."

A Ray of Hope: Transforming the Lives of Tribal Communities

In the picturesque hills of Bageshwar, Uttarakhand, where nature breathes serenity and tribal communities thrive, a ray of hope descended for local tribal community. Sanjeevani, supported stalwartly by NABARD's Tribal Development Programme (TDF), is working relentlessly to empower and enhance the livelihoods of the tribal households. Through our dedicated efforts and innovative interventions, Sanjeevani organization is bringing about lasting change and fostering sustainable development in the region.

In the heart of Kapkot Block, encompassing eight villages in eight Gram Panchayats, the impact of Sanjeevani's endeavor can be seen and felt. The organization has strategically focused its efforts on enhancing livelihood activities, creating a ripple effect that is transforming the lives of both men and women within these tribal communities.

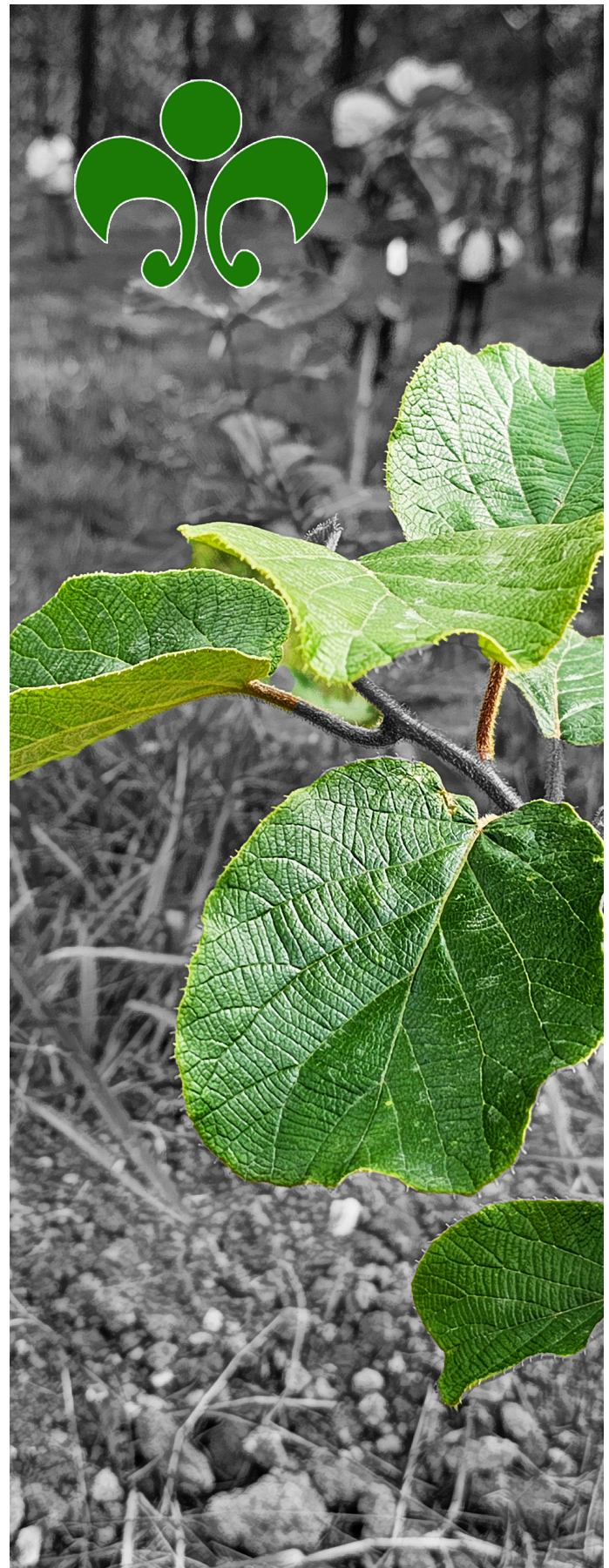
TDF project prioritizes improving the livelihoods of tribal families, particularly through agriculture and horticulture interventions. By providing technical support and guidance, the organization empowers farmers to embark on the path of prosperity. Through a comprehensive wadi development program, farmers are guided to plant kiwi, stone fruits, nectarine, and citrus trees. Each plant represents a promise of a brighter future.

Our efforts are not focused merely to introduce horticultural activities. The organization goes above and beyond to ensure the safety and success of each plantation. The entire plantation area is meticulously protected by a chain-link wire fence, safeguarding the plants from external threats, and facilitating healthy growth. This attention to detail demonstrates our commitment to long-term sustainability and prosperity for the tribal families.

Our objective extends beyond livelihood enhancement; it is about fostering empowerment within these tribal communities. By enrolling 80 males and 125 females in the project, Sanjeevani ignites a spirit of inclusivity, ensuring that everyone has an equal opportunity to thrive. Through training programs, capacity building initiatives, and educational workshops, the organization equips the tribal communities with the necessary skills and knowledge to leverage their potential and overcome obstacles..

Dedication, compassion, and steadfast commitment to rural development have become pillars of hope for the tribal communities of Uttarakhand. In the lap of the enchanting

Bageshwar hills, the tribal communities are witnessing a transformative wave powered by Sanjeevani, breathing life into the dreams and aspirations of the tribal households.



Sanjeevani's narrative echoes in the hills of Uttarakhand, invoking the spirit of inclusivity and fostering resilience as we carry forth our journey in the quest for further accomplishments. Project SEWOH, being implemented in Almora district of Uttarakhand, India, is a disability inclusive initiative by Sanjeevani with the support of German Cooperation (BMZ) and CBM. The initiative is partaking in an innovative endeavour aimed at sustainably boosting the socio-economic status of 2,500 small and marginal farmers, both with and without disabilities. Our odyssey commenced with a comprehensive, introspective glance at the prevailing conditions on the ground. A thorough baseline survey reached out to 2,542 households, 503 of which were home to individuals with disabilities.

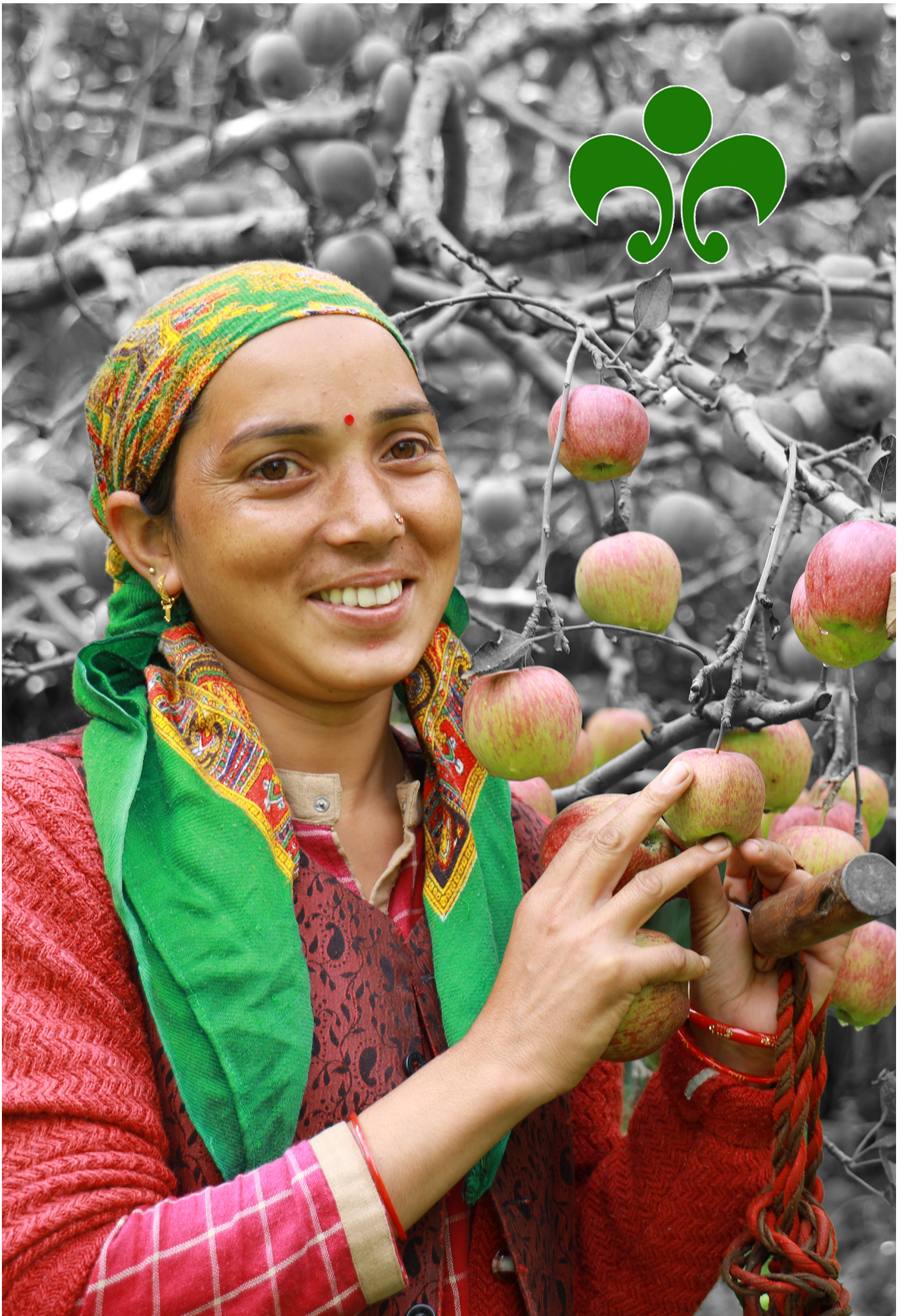


Sowing Seeds of Inclusive Growth and Empowerment in Uttarakhand



The study is an in-depth examination, which provides detailed insights into income and yield patterns and existing practices while recording prevalent challenges. This survey laid the foundations of transformative change. The project team facilitated formation of community-based inclusive groups sowing the seeds of unity and collective resilience. The groups were established and strengthened, incorporating 2,542 small and marginal farmers along 503 persons with disabilities. The programme team ensured to foster an environment conducive for active participation of persons with disabilities. By empowering the community-based inclusive group members to amplify their agricultural productivity, they were equipped with knowledge to enhance both the quality and quantity of their yield. The implementation of modern cultivation methods, introduction to high-quality seeds, and access to adapted agricultural equipment have all contributed to this objective. 30 training sessions have been successfully conducted, benefiting 1,504 small and marginal farmers, including 279 farmers with disabilities, & active participation of 1,191 women members. The capacity building of the households was initiated with the vision of reducing input costs while concurrently elevating household income through increased production. Historically, this programme marked the first instance where individuals with disabilities were included in any social group. This integration speaks volumes about the programme's dedication towards an inclusive, sustainable future, an effort that paves the way for a more equitable society.





Flourishing Together: Crafting a Green Future in Seraj Block

As the first light of dawn grazes the emerald valleys of Seraj, a newfound hope awakens in the verdant expanse. It's an echo reverberating from the communities supported by Sanjeevani and the CSR Parivartan initiative of HDFC Bank. The project aimed to improve the lives of the local farmers by bringing socio-economic reforms by changing age-old farming practices. Starting in April 2021, the Focused Development Project (FDP) began to support more than 2000 small-scale farmers in the area, particularly apple growers and vegetable farmers. The project reached 12 villages in five gram panchayats including Bung Railchowk, Tungadhar, Dhar Jarol, Sagalwara, and Dheem Kataru.

In our duration of engagement, the project has inscribed milestones that hold the promise of a brighter tomorrow. Initiated with the fertile ground for community enterprise through the establishment of "The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd." This cooperative sparked with initial success, boasting business worth Rs 20,44,000. Further, floriculture was introduced in controlled settings, creating a burst of color and an alternative income source for local communities.

Never deterred by adversity, the efforts confronted the area's water crisis by constructing 13 water storage tanks, each holding a capacity of 10,000 liters. This initiative ensured availability of water to irrigate and nourish the fields.

The project also promoted high-yield variety seeds of peas. This was done through the unified effort of our 2076 farmer partners. Marginal farmers' ability to store their produce was further enhanced by increasing the cold storage capacity for their harvests.

Our defining achievement, however, was the establishment of an apple processing unit. This value addition not only boosted the apple growers' income but also set afoot sustainable livelihood within the sheltering valleys. Through the value addition center farmers received a great solution to the C-grade apples which were initially discarded, which led to financial losses. The Himachal Farmers Producer Cooperative Society Ltd. proposed a sustainable option for 'C-grade' apple and breached the lobby of middlemen dealing in fresh apples, which led to enhanced income and sustainability for apple growers.

"Mr. Rakesh Kumar, resident of Kandhi village is an unsung hero amidst countless challenges, stepping bravely into unexplored territories, shining a beacon of hope for Mandi's native sons. Sanjeevani gave wings to this farmer's dreams, with HDFC Bank's generous CSR initiative 'Parivartan', as Rakesh found himself the proud cultivator of a futuristic polyhouse, nestled with 2500 saplings of carnations.

This was no ordinary change - once, Rakesh had eked out a mere INR 25,000 from the unpredictability of potatoes and cabbages. With the remarkable turnaround from the 'Parivartan' initiative, fertile prosperity bloomed with the carnations. By September 2022, the saplings were planted, and our farmer ventured into the wedding market; 2023 showered him with an astonishing INR 50,000, all within three short months. Moreover, it took just 90 days of labor a year, a friendly trade-off.

Sanjeevani's effort has thus sown the seeds of change, immersing itself in the unseen nuances of rural livelihood, crafting, narrating, and living success stories. The tale of Rakesh Kumar stands testament, a resounding proclamation of innovative and inspiring rural revitalization."

Empowering the Peaks: Rewriting the Educational Narrative in Uttarakhand with E-Learning

In Uttarakhand, education often treads an uphill path. Here, traditional pedagogy primarily relies on bookish knowledge, ignoring the imperative need for novelty and innovative thinking. Adding to the challenges, the shortage of time and resources make the ability to grasp new concepts an arduous task for students. Sanjeevani organization along with stalwart support of Life Insurance Corporation of India – Housing Finance Limited. CSR, cognizant of these systemic hindrances, embarked on a mission to overturn this predicament through an e-learning initiative across 40 government schools in Almora and Udham Singh Nagar districts.

Addressing the educational vulnerability faced by the children in this hilly region, LIC HFL CSR and Sanjeevani introduced interactive, engaging and comprehensive e-learning in 40 government schools to enhance the quality and accessibility of education. The primary objectives of the project include:

Providing a comprehensive e-learning platform for the 40 schools, taking into account the hilly terrain and the infrastructure limitations in these regions.

Motivating the students by piquing their interest in education, thereby countering the declining education interest prevalent in this region.

Enhancing the quality of education and ensuring better student retention in schools through creative and engaging teaching methods.

Offering an innovative solution to the educational vulnerability that these children endure, by providing them with a digital, interactive, and high-quality education.

To materialize this transformative plan, smart TVs with green chalk boards were installed in 40 schools, to foster innovative teaching practices. Additionally, to untether the schools from any limitations of electricity, solar panel setups were installed, thus ensuring uninterrupted power supply for the digital education programs.

Furthermore, teacher training sessions were carried out to instill confidence and familiarity with the new digital tools in the education personnel. The enormity of computer-based learning was understood and licenses for learning software were procured for each school.

The impact of this paradigm shift in the teaching-learning process has been profoundly positive. 98% of the schoolteachers experienced an expedited teaching process, as they could now elucidate new concepts more rapidly and efficiently via smart classes. 97.24% of students reported a greater understanding of concepts. The overall school attendance witnessed a 6% increase, reinforcing the growing interest in this interactive learning methodology.

Interestingly, 63% of teachers and students found the digital curriculum exceedingly helpful. 77% of schoolteachers expressed comfort in delivering lessons via the digital platform. Visual learning through videos bolstered the learning process, encouraging students to actively participate in discussions and utilize e-learning tools for their projects and assignments. This advanced platform has evidently amplified the students' self-confidence and their enthusiasm to learn.

The e-learning initiative has painted a new picture of education in the ruralscapes of Uttarakhand, a portrait of students eager to learn, facilitated by cutting-edge technology and supportive teachers. By shifting the focus from rote learning to an understanding-based, innovative approach, digital education has proven to be the proverbial 'Sanjeevani' for the distressed education scenario in the region. A proof that when technology and intent hold hands, the hills can indeed be conquered!

Catalyzing Change: A Leap Forward in Preterm, Maternal and Child Health

Under the sublime canopy of the Himalayas spread across Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, Sanjeevani strides to combat maternal and child health issues, particularly concerning preterm births. This developmental journey has been shaped and supported by Leo and Mia Foundation, to propel a transformative healthcare project.

Centred around the ambitious Project Goal to strengthen sub-rural health infrastructures, year 2022-23 has painted an optimistic picture for improving premature, maternal, and child health landscapes. The anchor of the project's success holds firm in its alignment with Sustainable Development Goals-3 & 5, underlining commitment to Good Health and Well-being, and Gender Equality. Four potent sub-centres, under this program, have been enriched with essential and modern apparatus, redefining the pregnancy experience for various women who found a comfortable and equipped environment. Under this initiative, distribution of 400 nutrition and care kits to mothers served as an additional pillar of support.

Sanjeevani, leveraging its expertise, held an enlightening orientation programme. It surfaced critical insights about project intricacies amongst the team, healthcare providers, community workers, and labour staff, fostering a collaborative understanding of the project. Sanjeevani remained dedicated to form a solid network with local health centers to direct referrals for preterm birth and maternal health. By plugging into existing health facilities, we aim to increase the access and quality of care for expectant women and infants. Our project attempts to bridge communication gaps between different levels of care from primary to tertiary. Indeed, the project has left a magnificent imprint on local sub-health centers including ANM Sub Centers, Community Health Centers and block level hospitals, increasing the frequency of visits and amplifying service quality. In its expansive reach, the project has covered two blocks of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, empowering women of reproductive age through the formation of mother's group, regular monthly meetings, and awareness workshops.

In the rural reaches of Uttarakhand, a resource-challenged 26-year-old woman named Neelam experienced firsthand the impact of the comprehensive approach to maternity care.

"Neelam, a resident of Nigrali village in Almora district, Uttarakhand, came from a below poverty line (BPL) family of four members. Neelam's predicament was exacerbated by her characteristics as a slow learner, and her inadequate understanding of the importance of prenatal care. Throughout her pregnancy, she grappled with health issues such as anemia, low weight, an insufficient dietary intake, and a general feeling of being weak. At the time of her first interaction with the team, Neelam's health parameters were far from ideal. She had a Body Mass Index (BMI) below the range suitable for pregnant women, indicative of being underweight. Further, her hemoglobin level, fell below the typically required range of 11-16 g/dL. She also had low levels of iron, folate, and vitamin B12.

Neelam's journey towards improved health began with the initial counseling sessions led by Neema, a community organizer supported by the programme. Neema primarily focused on making Neelam understand the importance of balanced nutrition during pregnancy and the role of supplements, specifically prescribed iron and folic acid tablets. She also informed her about the importance of the first 1000 days in a child's life on their long-term health and development. Following these interventions, regular monitoring of Neelam's health and close contact with Neema led to substantial improvements.

Four months into the regulated diet and with consistent monitoring, Neelam showed a striking improvement in her health. Her hemoglobin level returned to the normal range, her iron, folate, and vitamin B12 levels regularized, and her BMI rose to 19.8 kg/m2, considered healthy for pregnant women. Her fetus showed normal development. Neelam later gave birth to twin girls, both healthy and showing no signs of distress.

Programme's effective intervention signifies the importance of access to health care resources and knowledge in BPL households. Neelam's story offers an apt case study in how the right intervention at the right time can lead to improved health outcomes for at-risk pregnancies."

Silken Threads of Prosperity: Revitalizing Tribal Lives with the Oak Tasar

As we take stock of our endeavors over the past year, we would like to present the remarkable work undertaken by Sanjeevani through the 'Oak Tasar Project'. Committing to our mission of inclusive socio-economic empowerment, we began this project in eight tribal villages of Bageshwar district in Uttarakhand, in partnership with the Directorate of Sericulture.

The Oak Tasar Project aimed at uplifting the livelihood of these tribal families by tapping into the potential of sericulture. The focus of the intervention was towards the promotion of silkworm rearing and the cultivation of *Quercus Serrata*, a particular species of Oak tree the silkworms feed on.

Silkworm rearing emerged as the major component of the project, providing productive employment to the members of the community. Alongside theoretical know-how, Sanjeevani also provided hands-on technical assistance to the aspiring sericulturists. The immense dedication and constant support by our team helped them adapt to the new vocation effectively.

As we take stock of our endeavors over the past year, we would like to present the remarkable work undertaken by Sanjeevani through the 'Oak Tasar Project'. Committing to our mission of inclusive socio-economic empowerment, we began this project in eight tribal villages of Kapkot block in Bageshwar district in Uttarakhand, in partnership with the Directorate of Sericulture.

The highlight of the Oak Tasar Project was the equal participation of both men and women; with 185 males and 140 females actively involved. This fostered a sense of communality and interdependence that further strengthened their socio-economic fabric.

We believe in symbiotic growth, and thus focused substantial efforts on creating valuable linkages for the benefit of our target groups. Our team collaborated with government schemes such as the Oak Tasar Project. These strategically built linkages turned beneficial, adding a substantial value of INR 32923.07 to our cause.

Thanks to these sincere efforts, the Oak Tasar Project orchestrated by Sanjeevani has truly moved towards making a significant contribution to elevating the socio-economic status of small and marginal tribal households.

We stand proud of the progress made and are inspired to work towards creating more such opportunities in the near future.

We hold high regard for every individual who supported us in transforming lives through our Oak Tasar Project. We at Sanjeevani are eager to uphold the same commitment and usher a wave of change in more regions, and in more lives.

In the heart of Bageshwar district, among the lush green fields and vast farmlands, two farmers, Roop Singh and Suresh Singh, braved their everyday struggles to make ends meet. With five members to feed in each family and a mere income of INR 42000 and INR 50000 respectively, their existence was fraught with financial troubles.

The Oak Tasar programme, orchestrated by the Sanjeevani Development Organization, arrived as a beacon of hope in their lives. The programme was meticulously planned in episodic initiatives, each aimed at ensuring the all-round development and upliftment of the farmers.

The first step was Awareness. Often, the lack of knowledge or access to new & efficient farming techniques was a significant barrier for these farmers. Both Roop Singh and Suresh Singh along with others in the community were educated about Sericulture (Silk Farming) and the lucrative benefits it promises. They were introduced to Tasar, a type of wild silk harvested from the silkworms in the woods.

The next phase was Participation. It was crucial for the farmers to feel engaged and part of the process which is why field demonstrations, workshops, and interactive sessions were organized. Roop and Suresh were among the first to show enthusiasm and take active part in the programme.

Capacity Building formed the next vital stride in this process. The participating farmers were provided hands-on training in sericulture practices like silkworm rearing, disease management, and cocoon harvesting. Quality silkworm seeds and equipment for building the rearing houses were distributed at nominal costs to Roop Singh and Suresh Singh, helping them practically embark on this journey.

The grand finale of these initiatives was the creation of Government Linkages. Sanjeevani Development Organization ensured that the farmers get connected to government initiatives,



Strengthening Child Rights

CHILDLINE intervention was carried out in Almora district. This intervention was generously supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Welfare, aimed to provide urgent aid and long-term rehabilitation to children needing care and protection.

An around-the-clock emergency telephone service, forms the crux of our intervention. This service directly caters to children in need, by promptly responding to their situation, rescuing them from harmful conditions, and offering immediate care and protection.

We firmly believe that every child, regardless of their socioeconomic or health status, deserves to enjoy the fundamental rights accorded to them. Hence, CHILDLINE is not just a helpline but a lifeline, standing by every child that reaches out to us, regardless of their ailment, facing bullying, unwanted and underage pregnancies, difficulties within families, child marriage, and other perilous situations.

The service has been functioning effectively across the nine blocks of the Almora district, revealing the dire need for such interventions in remote areas.

During the year 2022-2023, our intervention has marked significant milestones. We successfully rescued and secured the welfare of 630 children, comprising 510 male children and 120 female children, displaying no discrimination or disparity. Out of these, a total of five children possessing disabilities were also safeguarded, highlighting our focus on the more vulnerable sections of the child population.

The biggest achievement was not just the number of lives saved, but the number of futures reshaped—the number of childhoods restored. Every child rescued from abuse, every child prevented from underage marriage, and every whisper of distress answered, added to our shared vision of an inclusive and equitable world for children.

As we progress, we will continue all our efforts to ensure each child, especially those from the vulnerable sections, receive the care, love, and protection they deserve. The path is long but our resolve is strong, and with the continued support of our partners and well-wishers, Sanjeevani is determined to create impactful instances of change.

We thank The Ministry of Women and Child Welfare, for believing in our cause, and the scores of volunteers, counselors, and well-wishers who breathe life into the CHILDLINE 1098 mission. Let us carry forth the beacon of hope for children in distress, ensuring no call for help goes unanswered.

We will continue to build a safe, inclusive, and nurturing world for our young ones, upholding their rights and dignity at all times. Their smiles are our rewards, their safety our priority, and their well-being, our mission.

Empowering Rural Communities through Sustainable Goat Rearing

As we reflect upon the achievements of Sanjeevani NGO over the past year, it is with great pride that we present the annual report for our SBI Gram Saksham project. Supported by the esteemed SBI Foundation, this initiative aimed to create alternative opportunities for marginalized sections in the villages of Syalde Block, Almora District, Uttarakhand.
